

Do you need a Maritime Radio Operator Certificate (ROC-M)?

Anyone operating a marine radio needs a Restricted Operator Certificate (Maritime) (ROC-M). It's the law!

This is a SELF STUDY course. This is not an on-line course. Following a period of self study the exam will take place at Willy's Galley on September 16, 2019. Upon successful completion of the exam, you will receive your ROC(M) - a Canadian Federal governmentissued certificate that allows you to operate a marine VHF radio.

* What: BOATING 2 AND 3 COMBINED

Boating 2 - Beyond Boating Basics

More than your Boating License

The PCOC makes sure you have immediate navigation and safety skills but it's just the beginning of what you should know when you get on a boat. In the second of our Boating Series, you are introduced to the art of navigation, anchoring, ropes, lines and knots - not to mention what to expect when the boat is moving under power. This course also has a number of optional topics that will be taught depending on your interests; these include towing, trailering and a check list for layup and launch.

Suggested Prerequisite: Boating I: Pleasure Craft Operator Card (PCOC)

Boating 3 - Introduction to Marine Navigation

The third course in our series explores navigation further as you learn how to plot and label on paper charts as well as what the skipper should be doing before setting out and when under way, handling a boat under sail as well as your environmental responsibilities and electrical hazards.. This course also has a number of optional topics that will be taught depending on your interests; these include tides and currents, canals and locks, and collision regulations.

You will gain an awareness of the maintenance required for critical systems, passage planning, provisioning, and visiting foreign countries, safety issues, emergency preparedness and weather tips.

If you want to cruise coastal waters, experience remote anchorages far from home or explore countries across oceans, Extended Cruising provides you with a deeper understanding of the skills necessary for confident, safe passages.

This new course covers the different types of RADAR equipment, their capabilities and limitations

Understand the available features and how they apply to your needs. Learn how to use your RADAR for collision avoidance and for navigational purposes.

The course covers everything about RADAR from how and where to mount the antenna to how to use and interpret the displays. Students attending this course should be in possession of their PCOC (or equivalent) and have basic navigational knowledge.

* What: SAILING

This Sailing Course covers the practical and theoretical basics of sailing and sailing seamanship. The range of topics is broad: from a description of different sailboat rigs, sail plans, hull types, and rigging to stability, balance, and the physics of sailing; from sailing at different points of sail to handling heavy weather and storm conditions; from spinnaker handling to reefing; from leaving the dock to mooring and anchoring. It also covers sailing safety, navigation rules, and sailing tactics.

Whether you are a new sailor or you are an experienced sailor and want to increase your sailing knowledge and skills, this course is for you..





What's for Dinner? Corn. Shrimp and Fennel Stew (serves 4)

- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 2 chapped leeks
- 1 chopped fennel bulb
- Kosher salt and black pepper
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 18-ounce bottle clam juice
- 3 cups whole milk
- 1 pound potatoes, peeled and chopped
- 3/4 pound shrimp, cooked, peeled, and deveined
- 1 package frozen corn, 10 oz.
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- Juice of 1 medium lemon
- bread, for serving (optional)

the fennel and leeks in the butter in the bottom of your saucepan. Stir in the flour. Add clam juice, milk, and potatoes, and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 15 minutes. Stir in the shrimp and corn, cook until potatoes are soft, and corn and shrimp are warm. Stir in parsley and lemon juice just before serving.
