## **Voting Basics:**

# General and Special Election November 7, 2017

### Requirements to vote on 11/7/17:

- Must have resided in City of Tucson since 10/8/17
- Must be registered to vote on or before 10/9/17
- Must be at least 18 y/o on 11/7/17

#### To register to vote:

- Fill out voter registration form
  - Arizona Voter Registration Forms are available at libraries, the Pima County Recorder's Office, Post Offices, and DMV locations.
  - Go to recorder.pima.gov/regvote or call 520-724-4330 for forms or more information about registering to vote.
- Provide document establishing citizenship (only need one and only need copy)
  - Arizona Driver's License number or non-operating identification license number issued after 10/01/1996 (number only; DO NOT send in the card).
  - o A legible photocopy of a birth certificate that verifies United States Citizenship.
  - o A legible photocopy of your United States passport containing your name and passport number.
  - A legible photocopy of United States naturalization documents or the Alien Registration Number (that begins with the letter "A"). If only the number is provided, it will need to be verified before the voter registration can be processed.
  - A Bureau of Indian Affair's Card Number, Tribal Treaty Card Number, or Tribal Enrollment Number (number only; DO NOT send in the card).

#### OR

- Register online at the Motor Vehicle Division website, <u>www.servicearizona.com</u>. In order to use that site, you must have an Arizona driver's license or MVD issued identification card that was issued after October 1, 1996.
  - If you do not have a current and valid Arizona driver license or non-operating identification license, you must include the last four digits of your social security number if one has been issued to you. If you do not have a current and valid driver license or non-operating identification license or a social security number, please write "NONE" on the form. A unique identifying number will be assigned by the Secretary of State. #### Where to vote:

Your polling place can change from election to election. Prior to every election you should receive a
sample ballot from the Elections Department and that should list your polling place for the election. If you
do not receive a sample ballot, you can contact the Pima County Recorder's Office at 724-4330 or go to

the districts for your residential address

- Drop off mail-in ballots at these locations on or before election day:

  - o Pima County Recorder's Office: 6920 E. Broadway Suite D
  - o Pima County Recorder's Office Processing Center
  - o Miller-Golf Links Library (Large Meeting Room): 9640 E. Golf Links Road
  - o Valencia Library (Large Meeting Room): 202 W. Valencia Road
  - o Flowing Wells School District Iola Frans Administration Center: 1556 W Prince Road

### **City of Tucson Offices and Issues:**

- Tucson City Council Members for Wards 3, 5 and 6 (elected by all Tucson voters)
- Financial aid for eligible City of Tucson families to pay for preschool education (paid for by raising the sales tax one half of 1%)
- More funding for the Reid Park Zoo (paid for by raising the sales tax by one tenth of 1%)
- A pay raise for the Mayor and City Council Members
- Voters in Tucson (TUSD), Marana, Sunnyside and Flowing Wells School Districts will vote on funding for schools.
