

Dr. William “Chandler” LeBoeuf is an educator and administrator with nearly two decades of experience in higher education and possesses a highly diverse background in student services, academic affairs, workforce and economic development, institutional advancement, and institutional accreditation.

Dr. LeBoeuf currently serves as the Vice Chancellor for Institutional Advancement and Strategic Initiatives for Fletcher Technical Community College in Schriever, Louisiana. He also serves as Executive Director for the Fletcher Technical Community College Foundation and the Fletcher Falcon Enterprise Corporation. Under his leadership, he oversees efforts in the following areas: workforce and economic development; continuing education; strategic partnerships; fundraising and development; grants; marketing and communications; alumni relations; career services and job placement; governmental affairs; community relations; regional initiatives for manufacturing extension partnerships; regional STEM outreach; diversity, equity, and inclusion; Title IX; food service; facility rentals; and corporate and customized workforce and academic training programs.

He is an effective team builder who fosters an inclusive culture, enjoys dynamic problem solving, and has a focus on collaboration and transformation while advancing the mission of education and training. He possesses a strong commitment to advancing equity and access for students to become lifelong learners. Dr. LeBoeuf is experienced in partnering with faculty to develop programs with business and industry that create opportunities for high-wage, high-demand career fields. His extensive involvement across areas in instructional and faculty development, student success, workforce and economic development, fundraising, student development, and external relations have allowed him to advocate for student success.

He has previous experience in for-profit enrollment management, serving in admissions, recruitment, and financial aid at the former ITT Technical Institute St. Rose Campus.
