

VINCENT G. JUNE, PH.D.

Dr. Vincent G. June has dedicated his career to serving diverse communities in public higher education for over two decades in progressively responsible leadership positions. His experiences include serving as Dean of Student Services for the Division of Student Affairs at Florida Gulf Coast University; Vice President for Student Affairs and Enrollment Services at Florida A&M University; Vice President for Student Affairs and Enrollment Services at Georgia Perimeter College; Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs at South Louisiana Community College (SLCC); and Interim Chancellor at SLCC – two comprehensive universities and two extensive access multi-campus educational institutions. Dr. June also served as a 2014-2015 American Council on Education (ACE) Fellow at Cuyahoga Community College in Cleveland, Ohio.

In his current role as Interim Chancellor, Dr. June provides oversight for all academic and operational functions of a multi-campus (8 Parishes) college operation serving more than 17,000 students annually. As a visionary leader with a keen sense for strategy and forward thinking, he has successfully worked with faculty and staff to develop and implement a college-wide COVID-19 Response and Reopening Plan, while also executing strategic efforts to support summer and fall 2020 enrollment initiatives. Dr. June has worked closely with the executive leadership to develop and complete SLCC's strategic goals and priorities for the 2020-21 academic year, while also aligning fiscal recommendations. Passionate about serving his communities, providing academic programs, and removing barriers to student success, he launched a comprehensive Retention and Completion Plan, championed the development and implementation of technological platforms, developed and implemented a comprehensive External Relations and Training for increased stakeholder engagement and support for the college, developed an Academic Blueprint, which integrates credit, noncredit/workforce, and adult basic education into one comprehensive strategic plan, and building on the College's Everyday Excellence initiative to support continuous improvement.

As a chief academic officer, and chief student affairs and enrollment officer at SLCC, Georgia Perimeter College, Florida A&M University and Florida Gulf Coast University, respectively, Dr. June has brought great energy and commitment to establishing innovative strategies and successful programs for engaging prospective, new and continuing students in the college experience. He has been successful connecting and partnering with local school districts, alumni, business and industry, chambers, community members, correctional units, faculty, and staff to recruit new students and increase institutional awareness and engagement within their respective communities. As a result, Dr. June has helped these colleges realize significant increases in enrollment, semester credit hours, and in retention and completion efforts over the years. Dr. June has also been successful implementing effective strategies to bridge collaboration between various functional departments and instructional faculty. Consequently, system approaches and processes have been developed across the institutions landscapes to integrate vast programs and services in ways that promote clear pathways for student success.

Over the past 20 years, he has successfully written funded state and federal applications for grants, as well as participated in fund-raising and partnership development activities to support academic programs, student development, scholarships, and institutional resources totaling over \$52.4 million. Dr. June has extensive accreditation, institutional merger-realignment, and governing board experience. His research interests include college-wide assessment to support retention, educational leadership in the academic and student affairs profession, and academic success for special populations in higher education. He earned a BS in business and economics from Florida A&M University, and received an MBA and PhD in educational leadership from Washington State University.
