



Dr. James Malm is Professor of Business and Chancellor of The University of New Mexico-Gallup, a two-year community and technical college in northwest New Mexico.

He formerly served students, faculty and staff in multi-campus community college systems in Arizona at Mohave Community College as Executive Vice President, Laramie County Community College in Wyoming as Associate Vice President and Head of the Albany County Campus, and the Community College of Baltimore County as Chief Administrative Officer for the Division of Continuing Education & Economic Development.
