Program purpose: Provide assistance towards childcare costs so that students parents can attend to their academic responsibilities.

In 2004, Cornell became one of the first universities in the nation to offer a child care grant for student parents.

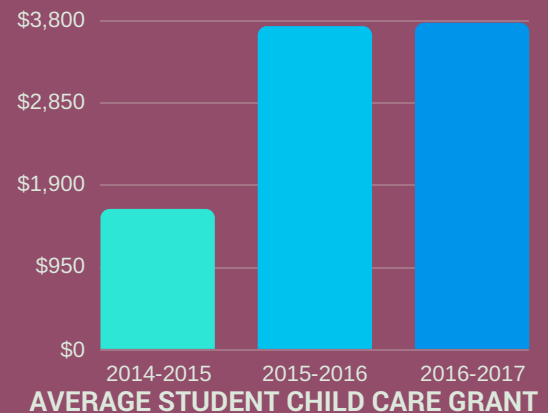

Child care grants awarded to student parents increased 133% in the last three years.

The amount allocated for student child care grants rose from \$106,000 to \$250,000 in 2015-2016.
