



Dr. Steven Tahan is Associate Professor of Pathology at Harvard Medical School, Medical Director of Dermatopathology at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center in Boston, Program Director of the ACCME accredited BIDMC-Harvard Medical School Dermatopathology Fellowship, and Emeritus Director of the Combined Harvard Hospitals Dermatopathology Fellowship. He earned an A.B. degree from Harvard College and M.D. from Yale Medical School and completed Pathology residency at New England Deacones Hospital and Dermatopathology fellowship at Mass. General Hospital. Over 30 years as faculty in the

Harvard system, he has trained over 75 dermatopathologists who are actively serving the Dermatology community in various clinical settings. He has authored over 120 peer-reviewed publications in journals and on-line on a range of topics including melanocytic and non-melanocytic skin neoplasms. Dr. Tahan has developed a special interest in quality improvement in the practice of Dermatopathology, largely through observations from expert consultations he has provided in medical liability actions. He is a recognized leader in Dermatopathology and has delivered numerous presentations to national and international audiences.
