They gave suggestions of what an event should look like, even including a list of the ingredients in the food that was being served.

Today, I went to the CIC for their Give Miami Day event and it was awesome. The event was accessible, the tables had tablecloths that were secure and not hanging on the floor, they had tables of different heights throughout the room, and all of the food had the ingredients listed on the serving table. I was so happy and smiling. They did not just talk the talk but they walk the walk.

They are doing what DIG loves, a social impact organization is being inclusive for everyone and modeling an event that works for anyone. They have embodied the spirit and meaning of the intersection of civic engagement and disability.
