- There are some plants that are dangerous for your pet. To list a few; Sago palms, Angel Trumpets, Oleander, Azaleas, and Red maples for horse owners. The University of Florida has comprised a well written website dedicated to toxic plants if you would like to find out more.
- Lawn stickers: Ever had a bunch of prickly balls stick to your socks and shoes as you cross through tall uncut grass? Well these little weeds can get stuck in the paws or even in the nose of your beloved pet. They can cause rashes or even infections if the area of the rash becomes infected. Try to keep your lawn up kept and stay away from unkempt lawns.
- Fleas and Mosquitoes: In the humid and damp lands of South Florida, fleas and mosquitoes
 flourish. Fleas love to hide in shrubbery and rocks. Look into products to put in your garden
 beds to deter fleas and are safe for pets. Mosquitoes love to lay eggs in still water. Change
 your pets outdoor water bowls every day. Keep your pets up-to-date on all their
 vaccinations and a have a monthly flea and heart-worm preventative. Discuss with your vet
