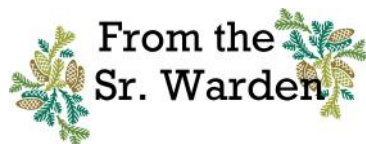
We were able to hold our Spring BBQ in June. Usually we do it in May. Nonetheless, we cooked 3500 pounds of pork butts and sold out by 12:30 on Friday. It was so good to see so many from All Saints' take part in this twice a year fund raiser for the parish. It was also good to see that the community of Morristown missed us holding this twice a year event.

Sunday morning in-person attendance is averaging around 120 people between the 8:00 and 10:30 services. Of course we are still live streaming the 10:30 on FaceBook and YouTube, and we will continue to do for the foreseeable future. When we count those who are worshipping with us online there are on average an additional 60 people joining us on Sunday morning. This means that counting in person and online we have more people worshipping at All Saints' than we did before the pandemic began in March of 2020.

So in light of the documented medical trends, and taking into consideration the increase of in person attendance, and seeing the need for us to restart many of our outreach ministries; it seems right to offer up the words we've been waiting to hear for more than a year. So, "Ollie Ollie in Come Free!" Welcome back one and all. You've been missed. It's good to see each other again in person.

With a successful one-day (part-day) BBQ event to help reunite the parish, All Saints' is coming back in full force beginning this July. Our mission-driven vestry has been reorganized after our first in-person vestry meeting since March 2020 and we were blessed to have Dan Leonard in attendance! It's hard to keep a good man down.

The BBQ had gross sales in excess of \$17,000 and netted \$6,000+, which are pretty remarkable numbers considering that sales began at 9AM on Friday and we ran out of BBQ, slaw, beans, and sauce by 12:30 that early afternoon. As we did not want to have any leftover pork and because we didn't know the response from the community, we cooked less than normal. Hindsight is always 20-20. The response from the entire parish to helping was remarkable and a testament to the tenacity of All Saints'.

As we move through the summer months we will be layering in our customary opportunities to serve and though they may not all be in the same format, we are now bringing them back. The first post-Pandemic Parish Breakfast on the first Sunday of the month will restart on August 1. The ALPS Walk to Remember will be held on July 31st and we hope to have a good-sized All Saints' team to participate this year. Bingo, too, will restart on the second Wednesday of August, 8/11. Solicitation of parishioner contributions of personal care items and standard cleaning supplies are the predicate of the program as these items cannot be purchased using SNAP benefits. We are also looking into restarting the Parish Picnic, perhaps on July 25. More details will follow during announcements.

August 8 we will be welcoming Bishop Brian's annual visit and another good-sized group of confirmands. Again, we will have more details forthcoming and preparations for the celebration will begin in July.

Our pews are beginning to refill with both current and new members of our parish and our online attendance is staying strong. We welcome all visitors and new members and our wearing of name badges makes it easier for newcomers to recognize who we all are.

And as always, we are looking for parishioners to fill positions on the rota every week especially acolytes, crucifers, and lectors. Please contact Lynne Ann at the parish office to offer your help.

ASES

As shared previously, ASES is still looking for talent. Our Early Learning Center (ELC) has openings for 2 and 3 year old teachers. If you know someone who might be interested, please have them contact Debbie Young, ELC Director, at dyoung@asestn.org or Fr. Smokey at headofschool@asestn.org.

Our 6th, 7th, and 8th grades are small in number so we are adopting a “one room schoolhouse” model for learning this August. This multi-grade/ability setting, along with using a Project Based Learning (PBL) approach to instruction, will allow much more self-pacing by students, meaning our high-flyers are able to move at faster learning speeds and our less experienced academics see more examples of best practices in the classroom. Even better, the mix of a 6-8 section with a 5th grade class (our full Middle School Division) for subjects like Music, Spanish, Healthful Living, and PBL as appropriate will push us to embrace 21st Century Learning Skills (critical thinking, creativity, character, collaboration, and communication) as identified by the National Association of Independent Schools.

After our professional development opportunity on June 3, the faculty came away with a deeper understanding of the keys to Project Based Learning (Inquiry based questions; Design, organize, plan; Student voice & student choice (teacher scaffolds student learning); Critique, revision; Real world application, public product; and Reflection) and an appreciation for how it will enhance an approach to education that is hands-on, constructionist and that fosters student ownership, leadership and the differentiation of instruction.

Interest in admissions continues strong. If you know a student who would benefit from an ASES education, please send them our way. Financial aid is still available. We are about educating children right in the eyes of God and those of the world, and mean to raise shepherds rather than sheep. PBL, a one room schoolhouse, the Middle School Advisory Program mentioned last month – these are all means to that end.

- A transformed understanding of your relationship with God, the church, and our culture at large.

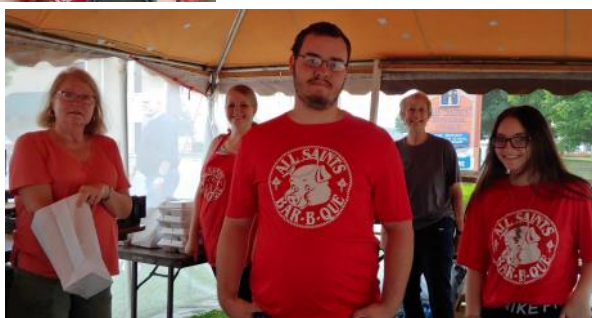

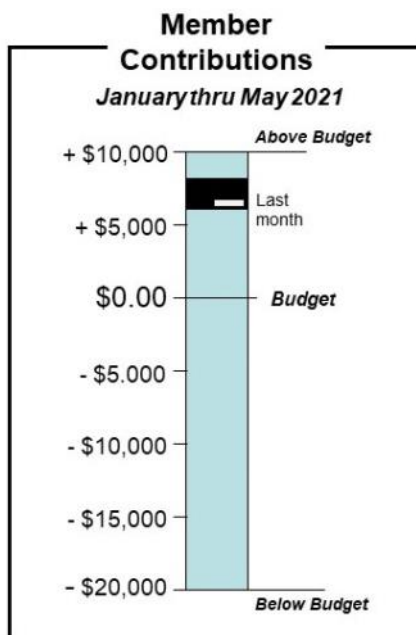

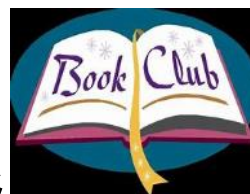
