

The Season of Christmas runs from December 25th through January 5th. Hence the 12 days of Christmas are marked with all such fare including: Seven Swans a Swimming, Five Golden Rings, and a Partridge in a Pear Tree. I have to admit it is one of my least favorite Christmas Carols. I think it is the repetitive nature of the carol that I find particularly obnoxious and thus it wears me down.

I haven't given it much thought before but during the Twelve Days of Christmas there are several feast days that the Christian Church marks. A number of them are quite heavy and vary sad. For instance, on the 26th, is the Feast of St Stephen, Deacon and Martyr. You remember good King Wenceslas. Everyone sings with gusto the first two lines: Good King Wenceslas looked out, On the Feast of Stephen. Then from that point on people just mumble and fake the words they can't remember. St. Stephen has been recognized by the Church as the first official martyr for the Christian faith. As I said, it's a bit heavy.

Just two days later, on the 28th, the Church remembers the slaughter of the Holy Innocents. Trust me when I tell you that when that feast day falls on the Sunday after Christmas, preaching on the Holy Innocents is not an easy task to undertake. How to you preach about the Herod's slaughter of so many male babies while Joseph, Mary and Jesus, escape to Egypt.

On some level, I have to wonder why those Twelve Days of Christmas had to include such tragedies. Why must such suffering be so near to the Nativity of our Lord? Then I remind myself that Jesus was both fully human and fully divine. Jesus shares in our human condition. Certainly Jesus was not oblivious to the suffering of others, even the very innocent. Neither should we.

Somewhere after the Partridge in a Pear Tree and Twelve Drummers Drumming, the Light of Epiphany is waiting for us. So after all the decorations have been taken down and put away until next year, after all the sweets have been consumed and the leftovers thrown away, allow the Light of Christ to illumine your life. Take care of yourself and while you are at it allow the Light to help you see others who might be hurting inside from the normal trials that happen during the Twelve Days of Christmas.

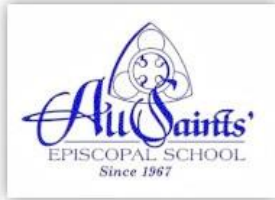

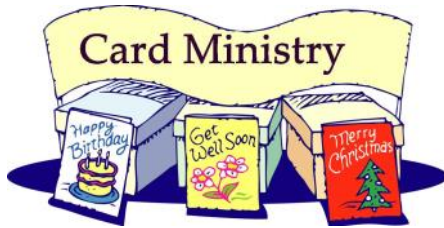
ADULT EDUCATION

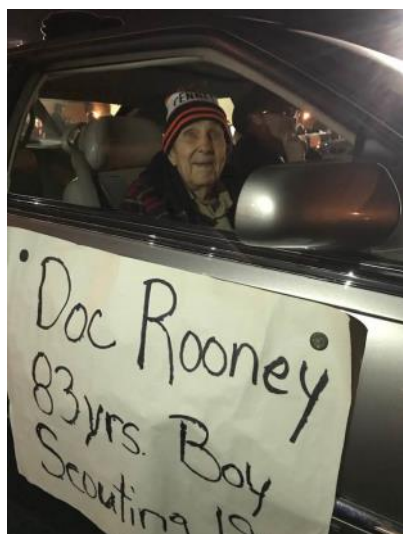
