

And so we begin again...

November 27 marked the first Sunday in the Season of Advent, 2022. We shifted over from our primary lectionary lessons from Luke in Year C to Matthew in Year A. We have changed from the seasonal liturgical color of green used after Pentecost, to the soothing color of Advent blue. In addition we shifted the Eucharistic Prayers that we use on Sunday. At the 8:00 Rite One service we now use Eucharistic Prayer I, instead of Prayer II. At our 10:30 Rite Two service we are using Prayer B instead because it has a more incarnational tone to it than Prayer A. We put away the Gloria for a few weeks in favor of the Kyrie and at the end of communion in Rite Two we now use the second post communion prayer.

So why is there so much shuffling around with the order of worship? It's a lot to take in for someone not familiar with the Episcopal Church and our liturgical forms of worship. Can't we just figure out what works and stick with it Sunday after Sunday? The quick answer to that question is...no.

We are a people of faith where the way we worship is a true reflection of what we believe. In Latin, it is said; *lex orandi, lex credendi*. We tell the story of our Christian faith by how we worship together throughout the entire year. We are a liturgical worshipping community. We use colors and symbols to enhance how we tell our story to others.

Our story begins with a four-week season of preparation we know as Advent leading to Christmas Day. Like the familiar carol reminds us, there are Twelve Days of Christmas, ending with the Day of Epiphany on January 6th. Depending on when Easter is set, the length of the Season of Epiphany varies before giving way to 40 days of Lent. Easter is determined by the first Sunday after the full Moon that falls on or after the spring equinox. Then of course there are the 50 days of Easter tide leading to Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, and the long greens season after Pentecost. Which brings us right back to Advent once again.

The foundation of our Christian Story is cyclical. However, the experience of our Christian Story is cumulative. This is why so many of us have our own family traditions connected with this time of year. Certain music must be played while decorating. Special food is cooked and shared with family and friends. People gather to watch classic movies like, *It's a Wonderful Life*, *National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation*, *the Christmas Story*, and now this year, *the Christmas Story 2*.

The point is that telling the story is central to our very being. Certain repetitive acts serve to enhance our understanding of how God became human flesh and lived among us. As we slowly move through the weeks on the calendar, we mark important events and milestones that help up tell the story. When we get to the end of the story on Christ the King Sunday, we pause for a brief moment and then we begin again. The unique narrative of the Christian story is that it is both never ending and one that is constantly evolving.

Last Sunday was the first Sunday of Advent - Year A. And so here we are. Let us begin once again.

I hope everyone had a happy and blessed Thanksgiving. And now we are in the season in Advent. I think our blue Advent vestments are awesome!

All Saints' is participating in several Outreach programs in December. Food on Foot is collecting robes, Bingo will host a Christmas Lunch with gifts, and our continuous donation of food to Central Services.

It is that time of the year that we recruit new Vestry members. If you are interested, please contact me or any Vestry member or Father Mark. Serving on the Vestry is an honor and a great way to understand how All Saints' works.

As we are winding up our Stewardship season, **if you haven't sent in your pledge card, please do.** And a big thanks to all who have pledged.

As a reminder, we will be decorating the church for the Christmas season on Sunday, December 18 after the 10:30 service. This will prepare the sanctuary for Lessons and Carols that evening.

In closing, me and my family would like to wish all of you a happy, safe, healthy, and blessed Christmas.

A Festival of Lessons and Carols is a tradition in many Episcopal churches. Its colorful history dates way back to the late 19th century, although many argue that it wasn't until 1918 that it finally became the service that we know today. It is usually held late in Advent. It is the ideal service for school chapels inasmuch as it tells our story from the fall of humankind to the promise of a messiah to the birth of Jesus. Imagine! Right before you leave school for Christmas break your school chapel gives you all you need to focus on the "reason for the season." At Sewanee (Cindy's and my alma mater) it is a gigantic event requiring advance tickets! But make no mistake, it's not only for schools. All may benefit from this beautiful collection of scripture, music, and prayer.

All Saints' has a very long history of offering this worship service. We will be doing so again this year on December 18th (Advent IV), at 5:00 PM. *After the service our Cub Scout Pack and Scout Troop will be offering a delightful chili supper complete with all the toppings, salad, bread, and beverages. The cost will be whatever you wish to contribute.* Three types of chili will be served: Pack 197 "Do Your Best" chili without beans but WITH angel hair pasta, a traditional with beans, and a vegetarian option with beans.

If you are a member of the Advent Police (you know, those people who try to excommunicate people for singing Christmas songs before sunset on Christmas eve) you won't have to worry too much. There's only a brief moment at the ninth lesson when St. John unfolds the great mystery of the incarnation. Just remember that the purpose of this service is to help us all focus on the Bethlehem event that changed the course of history . . . and our personal histories as well! Yes, we'll finish with the traditional "O Come all Ye Faithful" but we'll be saving "Joy To The World" for later!
