

I'm deeply honored that they have asked me to be the officiant at their wedding. I've officiated at over 450 weddings throughout my priesthood. And while all of those weddings were indeed special, this particular one will be even more so for me.

March in New Orleans is especially beautiful. The dogwoods and azaleas are in full bloom. The St. Augustine lawns will have returned to their usual lush green color. Spring in New Orleans means the temperature will be mild and the humidity will be low unlike it usually is during the summer. Everyone rides the St. Charles streetcars with their windows down. Boiled crawfish will be in season and the local cuisine will naturally be Cajun and spicy.

Signs of new life will be ever present and increasing in the weeks ahead. People will start cautiously venturing out once again. I hope this time we will accept how fragile the world is in which we live. We still might need to wear masks for a few more months. I hope that we will understand how much more we can experience when we choose to cooperate and work together for the common good. There are abundant signs of new life all around us. May God give us the wisdom to see new life wherever it springs forth.

It's a yeoman's task and requires dedication and hard work from many, many of you.

And finally, I would like to thank the recently-departed vestry members who served so willingly over the last few years. Victor Bailey acted as chairman of the administration committee for 2020 and his contribution to ensure the safety of the church and his tireless work to update the by-laws to allow the accommodation of so many changes because of the pandemic was truly heroic. Mark Joyce does so much for All Saints' and a lot of it is unknown to most. His chairmanship of the Evangelism committee was key that last year and every other. Sue Justis is another whose work was non-stop for three years on the vestry and her pastoral care ministry didn't end when she took the mantle of liaison to All Saints' Episcopal School part way through last year. Susan Fuhr had the unenviable task of being the Senior Warden during one of the most tumultuous logistical and financial years in All Saints' history. Her dedication and guidance served all and I express the deep gratitude of the parish for her taking the helm. Again, thanks to all and Godspeed.
