

## I'm Getting Too Old For This

I had a bit of an existential crises a couple of weeks ago. I found myself setting up my tent on a Monday afternoon all by myself for the youth summer mission trip. I was wondering aloud, "Am I getting too old to be doing this?" I was hot and sweaty. I was tired and not sure I was really up for a week of camping out in a tent on a cot without any central air conditioning.

I had serious doubts. I began going on these summer mission trips when I was just sixteen. Back then I was a member of the United Methodist Church and our youth group participated in what is known as the Appalachian Service Project or ASP for short. Every year we were given the task of helping to improve the living conditions of someone who had limited means to do so.

It was humbling to see poverty on a such a scale here in the richest country in the world. It was humbling to see people who didn't have basic indoor plumbing. It was heartbreaking to see hard working families fall a little more behind each year due to the relentless cycle of poverty.

This year I was wondering what in the world a small group of teenagers and adult chaperones from Morristown, TN, could offer that might make a difference for someone living in rural KY. It turns out that we had much to give.

We offered hope. There was the hope that this year an old roof would no longer leak and that the owner might be able to sleep in her own bed instead of on the couch. There was the hope that a new deck and set of stairs would make access into a home a little easier. We also offered a measure of dignity to our homeowners. Our presence on the job site said that they mattered and that we cared and were willing to invest time and resources on their behalf.

I saw a group of teenagers grow up right before my eyes. I witnessed them overcoming their fears and doubts in solving building problems with limited resources. I watched in amazement how new bonds of friendship were formed and how young lives were strengthened and empowered with newly discovered confidence. What an amazing week it was.

I might now be 61 years old. My body might not be as strong as it once was. I do sometimes moan and groan when I get up from the ground. The aches in my muscles are certainly more painful than they were in my youth. But to be part of what I got to witness on the youth mission trip, I hope I'm never too old to be part of that.

**ATTENTION ALL PARISHIONERS!**

As a reminder, a doorbell was installed outside the glass door office entrance. If you do not have a fob to enter, please ring the doorbell for access. During office hours, Lynne Ann can let you enter when you ring the bell. The doorbell can be heard from the Undercroft, the hall, Memorial Room and the Choir Room.

This does not apply to Sunday, Wednesday and ongoing scheduled events (i.e., Bingo) where Lynne Ann schedules the Auto-Lock accordingly.

Remember the Auto-Lock and the Alarm are separate. The Auto-Lock System is scheduled for access for hours set by Lynne Ann or with a fob. So, if you are the last person to leave the church, you are responsible for leaving through the glass office door and setting the alarm.

### Junior Warden August Report

**COPIER:** The new copier has been installed and running! The old one has been set up at the Serenity House as well.

**Roof Leaks:** We met with RLI Roofing from Knoxville concerning the leaks above the Altar. They inspected all the ceilings inside – above the organ, chapel and the entire sanctuary. No other signs of leaks were found. They repaired and caulked the flashing on the roof above the Altar. As of today, July 23<sup>rd</sup>, we learned that there is now a leak above the Chapel Altar! We are investigating this. As they say, “when it rains, it pours”!!

**GROUNDS COMMITTEE:** As a follow-up from June 18<sup>th</sup> committee meeting, we decided that our next project should be focused on refurbishing our All Saints' sign. We have received a quote from Morristown Signs for replacement of the sign. After their inspection, they stated that our existing sign is too rotten and damaged to refurbish/repair. The old sign would be replicated as new. The stained glass from the existing sign would be reused in the new sign. Our sign is sandblasted wood and hand painted which is considered a work of art that is the most custom crafted signs that are made. The committee met on Tuesday, July 30<sup>th</sup> and decided to pursue additional estimates.

In addition we reviewed the proposed site for the time capsule and concur.

**A/C:** As you may know, we have had problems with our air conditioning that serves the Sanctuary. As a result, we need to purchase and install a new disconnect for that unit. We received two quotes and have confirmed with Comer Electric to proceed with ordering and installing the new disconnect.

# NEVER STOP LEARNING

## Am I Good at This?

What would you need to become a better Christian? How would you measure your progress as you become more Christlike? Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control are the nine attributes of the Holy Spirit that St. Paul says are working through those who claim to follow Jesus. (As an aside, the Vulgate expands this list slightly. If you are reading Galatians in a translation based on the Vulgate you will find additions primarily underlining areas of self-control). But regardless, these attributes are treated as singular (“fruit” of the spirit; not “fruits”) in the original Greek. It seems that we are not so much to be concerned with counting these as we are with living our lives in such a way that this fruit is the natural outcome. That’s really good news!

The Adult Christian Education committee wants to put those first two questions in front of our parish as we enter the fall portion of our program year. If we claim to follow Jesus and his teachings then we claim that we are disciples. If we are disciples then it must follow that we are willing to learn and grow.

From time to time we will be offering programs (often with a meal!) that will allow us to have really good conversations about these questions. I urge you in the strongest possible way to consider them every day. Then, when you hear that Fr. Mark is leading a Bible study or that a Wednesday night dinner will deal with human trafficking or that Deacon Sarai is guiding us through a book, or that we’re building gingerbread houses or prepping for the barbeque . . . well, you might find yourself energized engage more deeply into your spiritual path.

As always, if you have an idea of topics that might be of help to our faith community in the realm of Adult Christian Education, let me or one of the committee members know! It’s an exciting time to be a Christian!

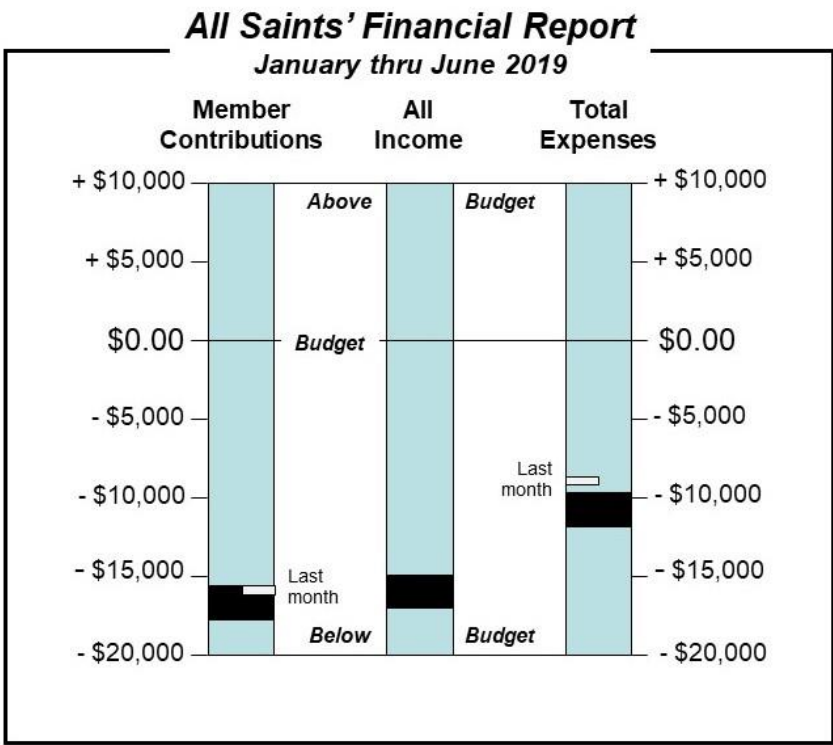
