

HALLOWEEN, ALL SAINTS', ALL SOULS'

It's no great secret that many secular holidays and religious holidays appear right next to each other on the calendar. The culture wars have been around a lot longer than most people realize. The Church has done its best to obliterate the pagan roots of many holidays by instituting religious holidays close by. Thus, it comes as no real surprise that All Hallows Eve, aka Halloween, falls on October 31st, while the Feast of All Saints' falls on November 1st. Just to pile on a bit, next the church placed All Souls' Day on November 2nd. It certainly makes for a crowded three days of festivities. The religious world often competes with secular influences.

While All Saints' Day has been traditionally observed on the 1st of November, no matter which day it might fall during the week, the Church has deemed it to be of such importance that it should also be observed on the following Sunday if November 1st falls on a weekday. Our Book of Common Prayer makes the designation quite clear. So this year while All Saints' falls on a Tuesday, we will observe our patronal feast on Sunday, November 6th.

We are also doing something new this year with the observance of All Souls' Day. In most faith communities All Souls' Day is known as the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed. *All Souls Day ... is a time when we particularly remember those who have died. The prayers appointed for that day remind us that we are joined with the Communion of Saints, that great group of Christians who have finished their earthly life and with who we share the hope of resurrection from the dead.*

It is hoped that it will remind us of our connectedness to one another is so strong the death is not able to separate us forever. *We pray to you for those we love, but see no longer: Grant them your peace; let light perpetual shine upon them; and, in your loving wisdom and almighty power, work in them the good purpose of your perfect will; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Advent begins this year on Sunday, November 27. We will be making Advent wreaths in the parish hall after each service on November 20.

Advent is the first season of the church year. It begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas and ends at midnight the day before Christmas. The name comes from the Latin word for "coming". The Advent season is the time of preparation for the celebration of our Lord's birth.

The advent wreath is four candles (three purple or blue, one pink or rose) on a wreath of evergreen that is shaped in a circle to symbolize the eternity of God. The lighting of the first candle symbolizes expectation and hope. The second represents faith. The third, which is pink, represents joy; the fourth candle represents peace.

If you don't have an Advent candle we hope you will join us and craft one. Tables will be set up with everything you should need.

Dear All Saints',

Three things happened on campus during the last week of October that, in many ways, are metaphors for life at ASES: one sad, one glad, and one mad with excitement. Implications from each will continue to play out over the rest of this academic year.

On Tuesday evening, a new working group formed. Under the leadership of Katherine Strate-Smith and part of the Board's Long Range Planning Committee, half a dozen community and school folks convened to begin dreaming about the best use of our abundant land on Maple Valley Road. The School has received a \$100,000 commitment from two families payable over the next five years. The question posed to the working group revolves around what our highest priority might be for using that gift, especially in light of our recent growth in enrollment. As you can imagine, the discussion was robust, heartfelt, enlightening, and hopeful.

'Mad with excitement' was my takeaway. ASES is growing, in numbers, programming, resources, energy, and scope. This working group reminds me of what has always been about the Church and is again good about the School: staying true to your call, keeping mission top of mind, doing your best to figure out what God's purpose for you might be in light of every new sunrise always leads to a good place. That this group is even necessary reflects the terrific work of countless educators, supporters, and leaders of this school over many, many years of hard and long labor. Mad with excitement because I like to dream.

Sadly, on Wednesday afternoon I accepted the resignation of one of our Early Learning Center's lead teachers. While parting is such sweet sorrow, we agreed it was mutually for the best. Family obligations had made it nearly impossible for her to attend to her responsibilities as I/we expect. Yes, we could have made accommodations, found some sort of work around. But that would have contravened the new culture of the school in which every staffing and program decision is made in light of what's best for students, not the adults in the room.

Fortunately, we had an exceptional assistant teacher in the classroom. She is now the lead teacher (we hope to continue growing our own) and we are in search of an assistant. If you know someone who might enjoy working with 2 year olds, please send them my way.

Gladly, at lunch on Thursday we relaunched a middle school book club who's first read will be Ghost by Jason Reynolds. Thirteen students raised their hands to join, with only a few lured in by the promise of Sharon's home-made cookies. The club meets for the first time shortly before Christmas.

One of our aspirations as a school is to graduate readers who are best in class, for with reading comes multiple benefits such as higher order thinking, robust vocabularies, an expanded world view, and terrific writing skills. We read a bunch at All Saints' Episcopal school though most of it is curriculum driven. Our book club (maybe we'll call it the Eagles' Eye Book Club) will honor our learning goals while encouraging students to grow more as young readers. Really glad Sharon loves to read.

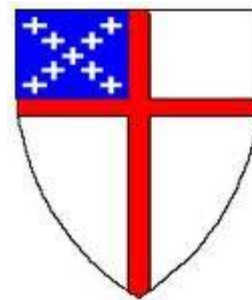

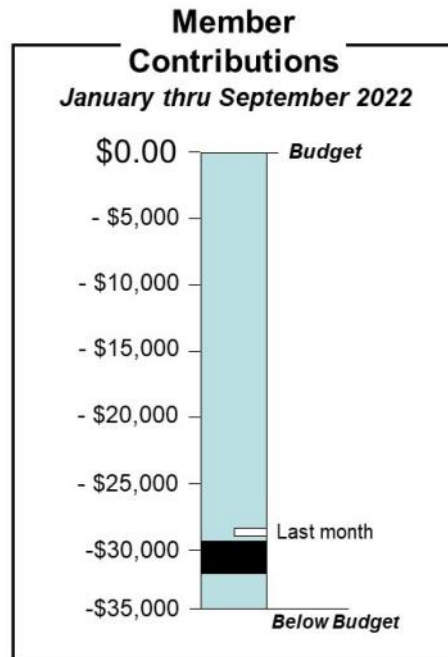
