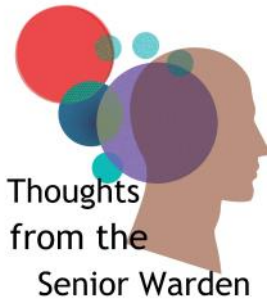

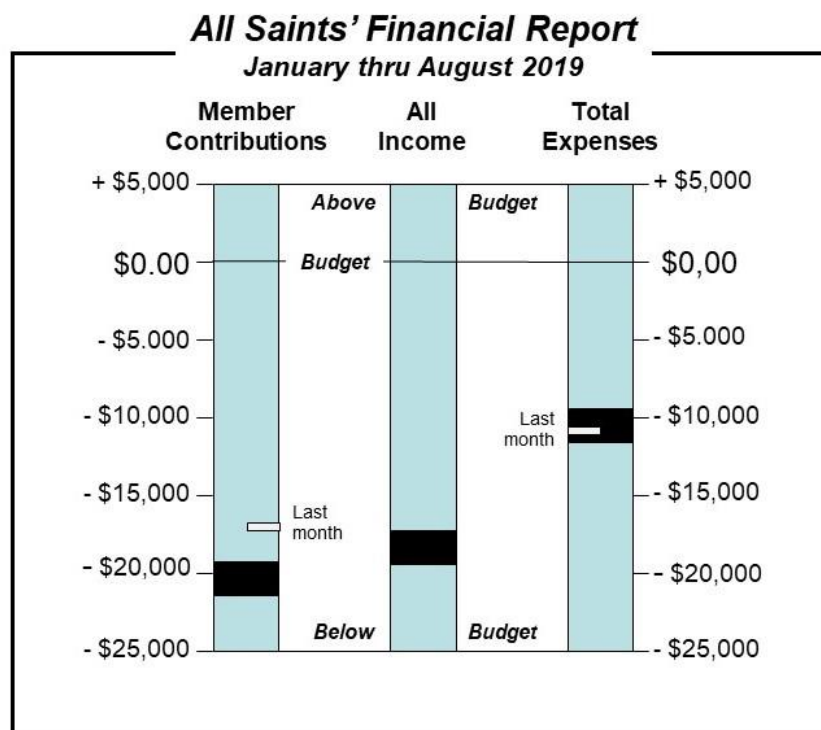

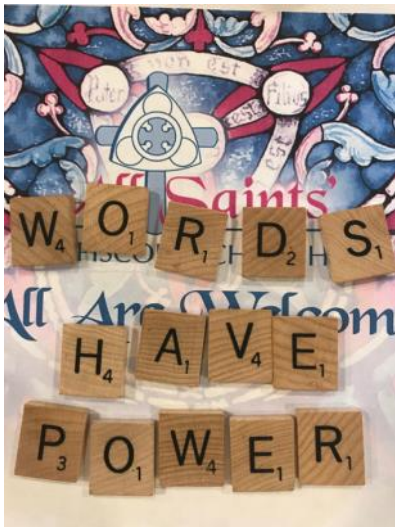
October days to fill food on foot bags will be a bit different than usual, October 6th we will fill bags at 10:30 service and October 13th we will fill bags at 8:00 am.

ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Trigger or Power words are used intentionally by persuasive writers in order to provoke a strong emotional response from the reader. Madison Avenue knows the power of such vocabulary like no one else! There are negative (and even some psychologically harmful) trigger words as well. "This won't be a problem" is a phrase that is often touted as a powerful negative trigger. Why? Well, it has a negative proposition ("won't") followed by "problem". Even people with broad vocabularies can react negatively to innocent words such as strict, judgment, attempt, and discipline.

A term such as "Sunday School" can actually have negative power for many people. Christian bloggers are having a field day with this topic right now! And that, my friends, is why we call our Sunday morning gathering "The Adult Forum". It's a much better term for several reasons. First, even though we have someone in charge of leading the group, it is clearly not the elementary school classroom model. Rather, it is a time of learning from each other and sharing with each other. The current program involves reading a play together in a sort of "Readers Theatre" and then sharing our thoughts. Second, it's great fellowship. And did I mention that we do this with really great coffee and snacks?

The Adult Forum gathers in the undercroft after the early service for some fellowship time. We then read for about 15 minutes and talk together for about 15 minutes. That's it! Officially it's 9:15-9:45 each Sunday unless the scheduling of a high holy day (Feast of the Never-Ending Bacon, e.g.) interrupts us. I can guarantee that you'll enjoy this time together. Hope to see you there soon.

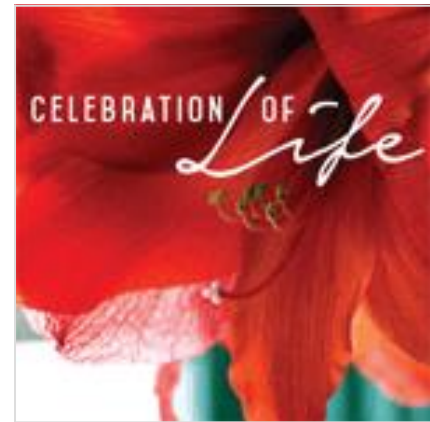

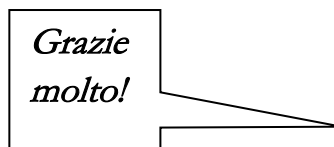
