

IT ALL DEPENDS ON EASTER

Have you ever wondered how the Church goes about figuring out the dates for some of the most important feast days? It turns out that it pretty much all depends on Easter Sunday. Pentecost, the Feast of the Holy Spirit, is always set on a Sunday that falls fifty days from Easter. Hence, the name Pente-cost, or the 50th day.

This year Pentecost will be June 9th. Do the math. April 21st is Easter Day. This means there are 10 days from Easter Day to the end of the month. There are 31 days in May. Bringing the total to 41 days. Add nine more days for a total of 50 and you have Pentecost falling on June 9, 2019.

So what about Ash Wednesday? Well the liturgical season of Lent is 40 days in length based upon Jesus spending 40 days alone in the wilderness fasting. So with the exception of Sundays which by definition are always Feast Days of Our Lord, Ash Wednesday, is set a total of forty-six days before Easter.

Once again, let's do the math. This year Ash Wednesday fell on March 6th. There are 31 days in March. That means 25 of those days fell in the Season of Lent. This year Easter Sunday falls on April 21st. So if you add up the 25 days in March with 21 days in April you get 46 days. However, there are six Sundays between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday. So if you subtract those six Sundays you end up with 40 days the Church sets aside for the Season of Lent.

This of course brings us back to Easter Day. You might be wondering how we choose the Sunday that is Easter Day. Believe it or not, there is a rather detailed formula for doing so. Easter is a lunar dependent feast day. Easter Day is set on the first Sunday after the first full moon that falls on or after the spring equinox, which is defined as March 21st. This year there was a full moon on March 20th. So the next full moon after March 21st will fall on April 19, 2019. Which means this year Easter Sunday for the year 2019, will be on April 21st.

I know it might sound a bit complicated but for Christians all around the world everything really does depend on Easter Day. Without the Resurrection there is no need for us to mark Pentecost Day. Without Christ's rising from the dead there is no need for us to keep a season of preparation such as Lent. As Christians, our faith starts at Easter Sunday and we figure out everything else from there. A life based upon the Resurrection begins at the cross on Good Friday and springs forth the empty tomb of Easter Day.

The Whitney Auton Scholarship Award is open to Graduating High School Seniors, University and College Undergraduates and Students in Technical Colleges.

Applicants must currently be or have been active members of All Saints' Episcopal Church and have a GPA average of "C" or better.

Applicants are required to write a **"Letter of Introduction"** to the Scholarship Committee sharing their life and educational accomplishments and goals.

The committee expects to hear about the applicants career interests, major fields of study, the institution where you will pursue your education and how you will use the scholarship award. Please also include any academic awards, extra curricular activities, community service, and church activities.

This Application and your "Letter of Introduction" should be received in the church office by April 1st of the award calendar year.

Tucker Memorial Scholarship Fund

The Tucker Memorial Scholarship Fund has been established by the Episcopal Church Women of the Diocese of East Tennessee to assist deserving females who are high school graduates or have obtained their GED and will need financial help to pursue a trade or college education. Based on need, grant of \$2,000 each will be awarded annually to female members of the Episcopal Church of East Tennessee.

The Scholarship is to honor Mollie Hazen Tucker for her faithful service to the Episcopal Church Women for many years: the example she presented to all who knew her, her strong leadership in Education, Worship, Mission, and in the Church at Large. The Episcopal Church Women of East Tennessee give Thanks to God for her life and witness.

The recipient of this scholarship shall be selected by a committee appointed by the President of the Episcopal Church Women of East Tennessee.

This is a one time grant for one year only, to be awarded each year to a female student.

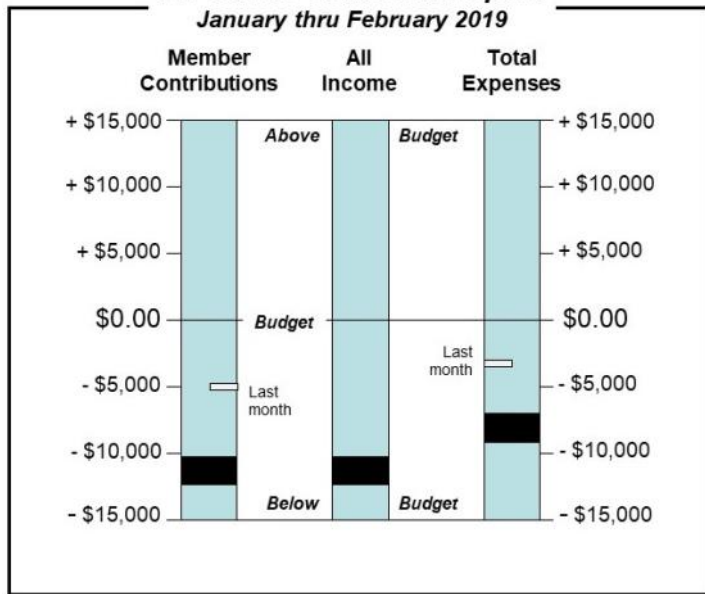
GUIDELINES

1. Applicant must be a confirmed female member of the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of East Tennessee, a high school senior or graduate and a candidate for the first year of an accredited college, business or technical school. Preference will be given to applicants exhibiting financial need.
2. Scholarship funds are confined to use for tuition, books, or a necessary school expense. These funds will be paid directly to the school or administered by the applicant's parish priest or Senior Warden.
3. The applicant must file a written application and furnish one letter of recommendation from each of the following: 1). her parish priest or Senior Warden if there is no priest available; 2). a high school teacher, faculty member or employer. These items should be collected by the applicant and submitted to the Scholarship Chairman in one envelope.
4. Applications must be submitted no later than May 1st of the current school year.
5. The Scholarship will be awarded the first part of June of the current school year.

A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP BRIAN ON THE NEW ZEALAND TERRORIST ATTACK

Micah 4:4-5 (NRSV)

*⁴but they shall all sit under their own vines and under their own fig trees,
and no one shall make them afraid; for the mouth of the Lord of hosts has spoken.*

*⁵For all the peoples walk, each in the name of its god, but we will walk in the
name of the Lord our God forever and ever.*

East Tennessee friends,

Last week, I attended the House of Bishops at Kanuga Conference Center in western North Carolina. The focus of our time together was on The Way of Love, the call issued by our Presiding Bishop Michael Curry to focus on a personal and communal life of seven practices for a Jesus-centered life. I believe Bishop Curry's invitation to practice such a life has the potential to renew the Episcopal Church and the communities where we live, serve, and worship.

At the end of our week, however, news from New Zealand reminded us that there is another way in our world – the way of hate. The New Zealand terrorist attack on mosques, on people gathered for prayer, is demonic and is the latest example that we live in a time when the stranger, the other, is seen as less than human, and less than worthy of dignity and respect and basic decency. From the promises we make as a community of the baptized, we reject this evil and promise to respect the dignity of all. All includes Christian, Muslim, Jew, person of faith and no faith. All makes for a big circle.

Yesterday, we heard a gospel reading where Jesus spoke of Herod as a fox. Herod desired to kill Jesus. In contrast, Jesus spoke of himself as a mothering hen, a vulnerable one willing to protect the most vulnerable. The way of hate, of bigotry and demonic distortions of the stranger, must be continually confronted with the way of love. The way of love remains a divine journey, where we daily embody another way, that includes all our neighbors.

East Tennessee is a long way from New Zealand. In God's world, however, we are neighbors. Muslims gathering for prayer were targeted and killed and wounded and traumatized. They are us. When we Episcopalians gather for prayer we walk again the Way of Love. We follow the mothering hen, not the killing fox.
