

## ALL THINGS COVID

How can something so small, something that technically isn't even alive, take away so many lives and totally destroy how we live every day because of it?

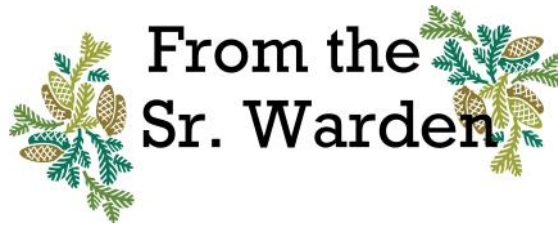
A few years back, Dr. Lewis Thomas wrote a book titled *Late Night Thoughts on Listening to Mahler's Ninth Symphony*. It's one of my favorite books in my personal library. Basically, it is a series of short essays on a variety of topics intended to provoke the human imagination. In one chapter Thomas discusses what he considers to be the modern "Seven Wonders of the World". His fourth "wonder" is a virus. The scrapie virus to be specific. It is a slow moving but deadly virus that affects livestock. He notes that at the time of his writing, science has yet to fully understand the true nature of this virus. Thomas also notes that a few isolated exposures can eventually spread to infecting billions.

Thinking about Thomas' book caused me to reflect on our present-day scourge, the Covid-19 virus and all of its mutations. To date over 688,000 Americans have died from this pandemic. Over 4.55 million people have died worldwide from it. Put that into perspective it means that 1 in every 500 Americans have died from the Covid-19 virus since the pandemic began a year and a half ago. Broken down further by age: 1 out of every 35 Americans over 65 years of age have died from it. The Covid-19 virus is no longer a hypothetical threat to us living in Morristown, TN. We've had numerous parishioners here at All Saints' become infected. Covid-19 has even taken the lives of loved ones in our parish and others closely connected to our parish.

Covid-19 virus has changed everything. Civility, tolerance, and understanding, are all once highly prized virtues that are now in short supply. The pandemic has caused divisions between family members, coworkers, and close friends. It has raised all manner of suspicions and all types of unimaginable false conspiracy theories. If you choose to wear a mask, then you are likely to be called a scared sheep by some. If you choose not to wear a mask, then you demand the right to confront those "fascist oppressors" who are preventing your "right" to go where you please. Reasonable discourse no longer seems to matter in our culture. Which makes me wonder where it all went off the tracks. At what point in time did it become acceptable to put others who were vulnerable with underlying medical issues at risk to the exposure of a known deadly virus?

In Matthew's gospel there is the passage of the "sheep and the goats". Jesus admonishes his followers by telling them that whatever you do to the least of these (the thirsty, the hungry, the homeless, the sick, and those in prison) you do also to me.

I would argue that getting vaccinated and wearing a mask should follow under that same directive found in Matthew. Those of us who do get vaccinated and faithfully wear a mask in public do so because it directly impacts the very least among us. It helps the sick, the weak, the old and the vulnerable. At the very least it's the Christian thing to do.



As most of you are already aware, the Vestry voted to cancel the Fall BBQ again because of the high number of active cases of Covid-19 in our area. We will continue to pray that by next Spring the community will be safe enough for us to have a regular BBQ event.

We are already planning our third reopening of All Saints' when it is safe again to do so, perhaps by early November. All of the efforts involving this process require coordination among the Rector, the Vestry, and the various groups who gather in our building. Let's pray that more members of our community see their way to getting vaccinated, as we are still hovering in the 40% range.

The Vestry is the management team of the church and members are elected by the parish to represent it. Each member serves for three years and the time for that election cycle starts soon. This year we are electing three members to replace the four people whose terms will be finished in February. The reason that we are adding one less than we are losing is that we are in process of reducing the size of the vestry. This year we go from eleven members to ten next year.

Please see if you can find a place in your heart to devote to helping All Saints' rebound from the very rough past couple of years by contributing your time to working on the Vestry. If you know of a member of the parish who is a good candidate, please let them know. When we begin the selection process, we'll make it easy to add your name to the list of candidates.

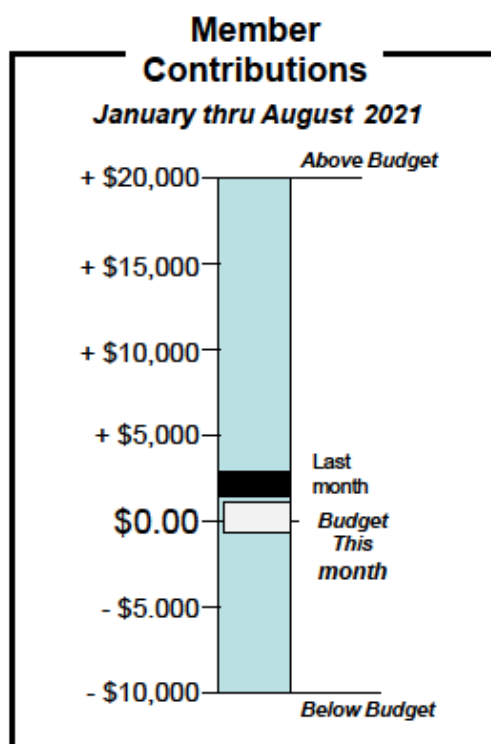

To the ASEC congregation:

Greetings from the Woolsey family! We greatly appreciate the prayers and support on our behalf that your church and its members have made in support of our work in Mongolia. We just wanted to provide you all with an update about some changes that have occurred over the last few months to keep you current with what is going on in our ministry.

First, there has been a major change with our sending agency. For many years Christian Veterinary Mission (CVM) has been under the umbrella of CRISTA Ministries, which is based in the Seattle, Washington area. On July 1, 2021, CVM officially separated from CRISTA to form its own non-profit organization. Overall, we do not expect any deleterious effects on our ministry. The leadership and those we work with will remain unchanged. Veterinary missions was never really in the vision of CRISTA, but they had graciously provided support to CVM over the years so that CVM could continue its ministry. After much prayer and consideration, the Board of Directors and leaders for CVM decided that since our vision was significantly different from the rest of CRISTA and with continued growth experienced over the last years, we could fulfill our purpose and vision best by forming a new organization. Since we work with animals, I like to think of in terms of a fledgling bird. CRISTA help see CVM through the developing years, but now it is time to leave the nest. We know there will still be many difficulties ahead but are confident that the Lord has equipped us for what lies in the future. Many of you may have received letters or other communications telling about this transition and how to continue to keep up with us. If you didn't, we apologize we missed you and invite you to connect with us again. This can be done quickly and easily by going to [www.cvm.org/woolsey](http://www.cvm.org/woolsey) and signing up for our newsletter. If you would like to financially support our work, this can be done from the same website.

The second update is that we have had to temporarily returned to the USA. Our son was having some ongoing GI issues, and we were unable to determine the cause while in Mongolia. It was also becoming apparent that without vaccines our ability to do much of anything in country (from traveling to getting your hair cut) would be significantly limited, and we were not comfortable with the vaccine options available to us. As we took all of this into consideration, we determined that the best thing would be for us to go ahead and return to the USA to see some GI specialists and get vaccinated. We have hopefully found out the main issue for Caleb is that he is unable to digest lactose and to a lesser extent sucrose. We are grateful to be getting some answers and that we can treat the issue by simply avoiding certain things. However, we also recognize that there could be difficulty in finding appropriate dietary foods in a developing country. Many of the dairy substitutes that are available here, won't be available there. So, we certainly appreciate your prayers as we navigate through determining how to handle this. We are looking forward to returning to Mongolia once the doctors feel we have a good handle on everything.

Other things to keep in your prayer include the small animal clinic I work with. For the second time in just under a year, we were forced to leave our physical building and have yet to find a replacement location. Also, you can pray for some of the countryside ministries. They were significantly limited due to COVID-19, but recently, some outbreaks of infectious animal diseases have limited the ability to travel to certain areas even more. Blessings to you all.

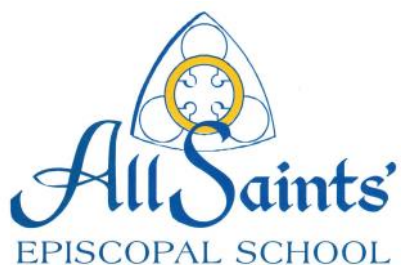

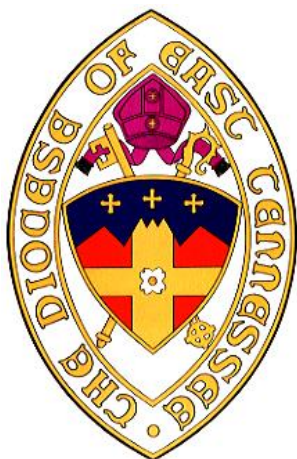

## ATTENTION PARISHIONERS USING ON-LINE GIVING

Our On-Line giving service provider Vanco has informed us that on September 30<sup>th</sup> they will discontinue using “GivePlus+” as their mobile application and move to a new application named “Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement.” They will also change the on-line giving Web Page on our parish website.

### MOBILE APP:

To move to the new mobile application download the app to your mobile device from the **Apple App** or **Google Play Stores**.

When you go to the App Stores look for the following icon:



“Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement”

Find the church within the app by entering: **All Saints Episcopal Church Morristown**

Your old login and password should transfer to the new app when it is downloaded.

Should you have a problem with your new login try changing your password with the “Forgot Password” command in the lower part of the screen.

### WEBPAGE GIVING:

For families using the **Web Page** you will not need to download anything you will be taken directly to the **new site on September 15** when you select “Online Giving.” Your logon and password should also transfer to the new page.
