This is a brief highlight of the year for Outreach and reminder of what is happening in January.

First off, Outreach is not the committee or just a committee. Outreach is All Saints' parishioners who engage the local community, the regional community, the national community and the international community with support in a variety of ways. These parishioners are young and old alike. The youth of the parish are very active with Outreach projects. One project was donating funds to the Women's Empowerment Program in the Diocese of Kondoa in Tanzania.

The loose offering on the 2nd Sunday of the month supported the following organizations in 2017: CASA, Serenity House, CEASE, Noah's Arc, All Saints Episcopal School, Helping Hands Clinic, ECW Bingo, Rose Center, Troop 197, Central Services Holiday Hope Fund and the Diocese of Kondoa in Tanzania. The loose offering in January 2018 will go to Serenity House. There will be a guest speaker at the January 10th Agape dinner to talk about Serenity House.

Over 1100 bags of food were filled and then distributed by you in support of Food on Foot a local organization that saw the need to feed hungry children and their families. You also stepped up to provide pajamas and school supplies for these children. In January you can continue this outreach by filling bags on January 10th and January 24th during the Agape Wednesday dinner. Distribution will happen on Saturday the 27th at Food on Foot.

Bingo!!!! Enough cannot be said about this. Close to 70 persons from the Morristown Housing Authority and their friends were fed and given gifts as part of the December Bingo event. Yes, it was an event. Over 90 persons were fed when you add in the persons helping. January 10th is the date for bingo this month. Since, Bingo is now officially an event, you may want to come join in and maybe help out and/or play Bingo.

Central Services the 12 days of Christmas food drive will end on Sunday January 7th the day after the Epiphany. Let's fill up the Altar. Thanks for your generosity throughout the year as the Lenten offering for Central Services was successful and nearly every Sunday a basket of canned goods are blessed and taken to Central Services. Boy Scout Troop 197 has not only collected and then donated foot to Central Services they actually put in time at Central Services helping with food distribution.

ECW, the Wise Men and generous parishioners who answered the request for funds sent several campers to Camp Billy Johnson and Grace Point. One of those campers is in the process of becoming a camp counselor. Lend a Hand has moved furniture, built hand rails and walkways, hauled some appliances and helped with Bingo. Over 50 hand knitted caps were recently dropped off at the Morristown Hamblen Cancer Center for those undergoing cancer treatment.

Obviously, Outreach is you and me, however there is still a committee and there will be an Outreach committee meeting on January 9th at 5:30pm. It will at the McGowan's you are welcome to join us for a meeting and then a Potluck dinner.

WHAT BROUGHT YOU TO ALL SAINTS?
