

THERE IS SOMETHING ABOUT SPRING

I really love the fact that we have four real seasons here in East Tennessee. This was not the fact when I lived in Louisiana. There, the fall season was about three weeks long starting from Mid-November. Next we would get our first peak at winter with the first frost. More often than not it was followed by a fake fall which meant the temps went back up to the mid 80's again for a couple of weeks.

Winter might actually be as long as ten days. This occurred when the temperature dropped below 40 degrees. Though in Louisiana most people were known to fire up the gas fire places when the air temp got below 55. Spring might possibly be as much as three weeks long. Spring was easily identified by the blooming of azaleas and dogwood trees. Then it was followed by a weeks return to fake winter for a week or two depending if Punxsutawney Phil saw his shadow or not that year. Then we settled in for basically eight months of summer. This meant 100% humidity and temps in the high 90's or even higher.

When I lived in Chicago it was pretty much reversed. Winter was eight months long with temps seldom above 30 degrees and we could have months of gray overcast skies where we never saw the sun. Spring only lasted one week. It was usually the first week of June. Fall also lasted only about one week before the first blizzard. Summer could fluctuate from three to six weeks depending if we were lucky.

Here in Tennessee we get the best of all four seasons. Though I have to admit spring is my personal favorite. I love this time of year when the daffodils are in bloom. I love waiting for the wild Dogwoods and Redbuds to come alive. We don't have much in the way of azaleas here but we do have Rhododendrons which are spectacular by any measure and well worth the drive into the mountains to see them in full bloom.

Another sign of the return of spring happen when the TVA begins to let the water levels rise in the local lakes. Life begins to emerge from its winter hibernation. Wildflowers are in abundance everywhere you look. One night you would swear that your front yard was brown and then overnight it is suddenly appears a verdant green.

So much in nature reminds you of the sheer abundance of God's creation. Spring reminds you that what might appear dormant is really never dead. It's good to live in East Tennessee. We are blessed with so much that most of us tend to take for granted. Enjoy it. Enjoy it all. Get your hands dirty in potting soil. Put in your vegetable gardens. Share a portion of your produce with your neighbors. For God has been especially good to those of us who live in Tennessee.

It's hard to believe that February has gone and I've just passed my two year anniversary with the School. My first three months were as a volunteer consultant working under the direction of Mo. Gigi. She did a terrific job as Head of School, leaving me with a wonderful template to continue her good work. Hopefully, when Dr. Steven Sorrell arrives this summer, he'll be able to say much the same of my time in the gray chair. Following are a few details about some topics he and I have been discussing over the last couple of weeks.

Admissions

Reenrollment contracts for the 2023-24 academic year have been issued. To qualify for the Loyalty Discount (5%), a signed document and deposit need to be in Sarah Ringley's hands by close of business, March 1. New enrollments officially start March 1, though in classes with empty seats, we've already begun issuing contracts. With March 1, admissions becomes first come, first serve.

When I started assisting in February, 2021, we had 109 students attending ASES. We opened that August with 109. This year we opened with 139 students. Today we have 151 students enrolled and are looking at acquiring Temporary Learning Cottages (TLC's) to provide additional space for our continuing growth. All of this is to say that if you or someone you know are interested in an All Saints' education, you would be well advised to get your contract in or interest known sooner than later. I can't guarantee a seat will be open then as opposed to now.

Auction & Gala

It is, absolutely, indisputably, the best party in town. The Annual ASES Blue and Gold Auction & Gala starts at 5:45 on Saturday, March 4 in our nearly unrecognizable gym. Tickets are available on the school's website; sponsorships can be arranged through Sarah (sringley@asestn.org), Jersey Girl is catering and I have begun to chill the beverages. A silent auction is live online now including class baskets (blueandgoldgala2023.cbo.io); there will be a live, in person auction the night of the event.

This is my last auction & gala as the head of school. I do hope you will join me, the faculty and staff, the Board of Trustees, and 250 of your closest friends for a terrific time. Dr. Sorrell will not be able to attend but is putting together a screen greeting. If you need someone to sit with, please reach out to Sarah or me. We'll get you hooked up. Attire is dressy casual.

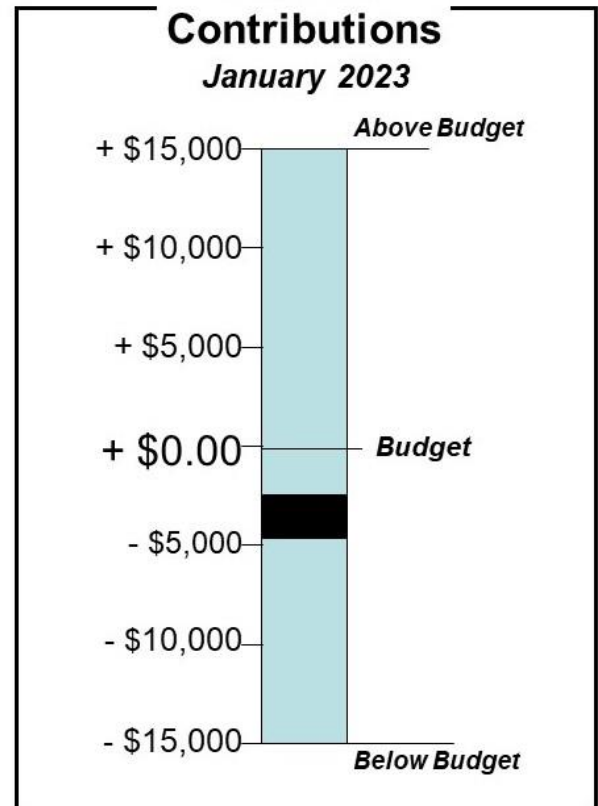

Foyer Reshuffle

Spring 2023 Foyer Groups!!!

Hungry? We've got dinner plans for you! It's time for our annual **Foyer Reshuffle**. This year we'll be doing our reshuffle virtually and will let you know by the end of the month who is in each group. We won't reshuffle again until late September, giving everyone ample time to work around vacations and the random plans of "life".

What's a Foyer group?

Foyer is a French word meaning "hearthside" implying the warmth of a close, small group of friends sharing a common love and concern for each other. The history of Foyer Groups comes from Coventry England. After the World War II bombing of Coventry Cathedral, small groups of people began meeting to rebuild their community: a short litany, a modest meal, conversation. The tradition has spread across many Christian communities and has a long history here at All Saints.

Foyer groups are small groups (usually 5-8 people) open to all church adults- singles and couples - and are designed for the purpose of getting to know fellow parishioners over a meal. We do ask each group to invite someone new to each dinner. Foyers are strictly social events – gatherings can be dinners, brunches or even picnics! Foyer group members take turns hosting a dinner (usually monthly). Foyer meals are not “fancy”- soup and sandwiches are fine– these gatherings are simply an opportunity for fellowship and friendship and lots of laughter. We meet each other where we live and accept each other as God accepts us as we are. You don't need to be a “couple” to join foyer – we'll find a “match” for you or feel free to pair up with a friend!
