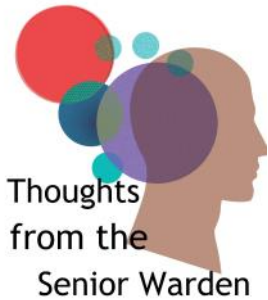
How about this year we try something different and give ourselves a break? How about this year we intentionally pace ourselves and set reasonable limits on our time before we say yes to a holiday event. I know that Christmas decorations have been up in Lowe's and Home Depot since right after Labor Day. I realize that Christmas music began broadcasting 24/7 on satellite radio since early November. I also realize how crucial the "shopping season" is to so many retail stores. We are awash with holiday images that encourage us to buy more, eat more, and do more.

This doesn't mean that we have to buy into all of the craziness. Put another way: "These aren't my monkeys and this isn't my circus." I don't believe many of us are really happy about rushing from place to place, from home to home, in order to make an appearance at every single holiday event for which we have received an invitation. Perhaps this year we could choose to schedule our lives in a better way. Maybe this year we might seek the right balance between social holiday times and quality Advent time.

For starters, there really are Twelve Days of Christmas. From December 26th, through January 6th, the Day of the Epiphany, the church marks the liturgical season of Christmas. Think of those twelve days as much needed extra room in your life. It's kind of like the relief you get from loosening up your belt buckle a notch or two after overeating a huge meal. You feel better about the extra room especially without all the internal extra pressure. The holiday gatherings really can be spread out. There is no rule that says everything in your life must happen before the 25th of December.

Next, I would suggest holding back a few days during the holidays just for family and close friends. Advent is about sharing and preparing for the coming of the Christ Child into the world. Part of those preparations might be better spent in quiet conversations and intimate prayer time. Feeding your spirit should be just as important as feeding your physical body.

Finally, I would suggest to you that less might actually mean more. Choosing to focus on fewer social obligations might make them more meaningful and enjoyable. If you are one of those who tend to dread all the obligations that are put upon you between Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day, this might be the right time to change up your routine and give yourself a little more room to live into Advent. Be kind to your soul during the Season of Advent.

Can you believe that it is December already? My, has the year flown by. This must be another sign of a church taking on what Christ has called us to.

GROUNDS COMMITTEE: Sign refurbishment is completed and it is beautiful!! We've raised approximately 2/3 of the cost, so there is still opportunity to donate to the fund. If you would like to donate to the sign restoration, please designate "sign" on your check. If you prefer to pay with cash, please place in an envelope and designate "sign".

ROOF LEAKS/DRY WALL REPAIRS: Although new sealant along the seam of cap and brick, where leaking was occurring, has been completed, we now have additional dry wall damage on the altar wall. We met with the paint company (used previously) on Friday, November 8th. The conclusions made during this inspection are that water is leaking through the outside brick and trapping moisture behind the sheet rock. Evidence of this is both inside and outside. The recommendation is to contact a brick mason to tuck and point the outside brick wall (altar wall) as well as the brick outside the chapel wall where additional evidence of leakage was also found. Once this is done, the brick would then need to be sealed which, according to several past Junior Wardens, has never been done. After all this is completed, the interior wall damage can then be repaired.

There are numerous other areas where the brick mortar is deteriorating and moisture could be seeping into the interior walls. This has been an ongoing problem for many years. Obviously, this is a major issue and will require expert input for resolution. At this time, we will begin working on the brick repair process before any sheet rock and painting repairs are made inside.

SANCTUARY LED LIGHTING: Several light bulbs directly above the altar are burned out. We met with Comer Electric on Monday, November the 11th to discuss replacing the bulbs. Since this requires scaffolding, which is the biggest part of the cost (includes; pick up and return, setup and teardown), we asked them to provide us with a cost to replace all 36 existing bulbs. This will also provide the same color for all the sanctuary bulbs (LED dimmable) plus 13 to 25 years of not changing bulbs again!

Please see the attached quote. I need your approval for this expenditure and commitment.

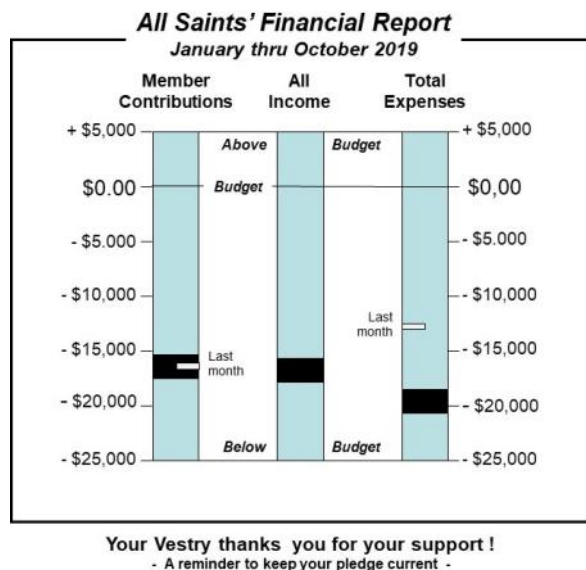
Rowan Williams served as the 104th Archbishop of Canterbury from 2002 to 2012 and is now Master of Magdalene College (Cambridge). Adult Christian Education (or "formation") is fundamentally a way for us to be changed by bigger ideas. Abp. Williams went on to say that Advent is the ideal season to use all of our senses in order to accomplish change. Discipleship is awareness! It is inextricably bound up with "expectancy" which, as we all know, is the central theme of this new beginning of the church year.

All Saints' is a very busy faith community. We've got a busy building every day of the week, but we're also busy off campus with one event or another! With all the hustle and bustle, let's be sure to take some time to allow some "bigger ideas" to wash over us. Perhaps then we can all sing that wonderful chapel song: "I see the love of God in you, the light of Christ come shining through; and I'm am blessed to be with you, O holy child of God."
