

Dr. Amam Saleh new WRCH Medical Director

After four years as a staff psychiatrist at the Oklahoma Forensic Center, he joined the WRCH staff as a forensic psychiatrist in 2015. During his tenure in Oklahoma, Dr. Saleh earned an International Diploma in Mental Health Law and Human Rights from the Indian Law Society in 2013. During his first year on the WRCH faculty in 2015-2016, he served as a Fellow in Forensic Psychiatry

Research at the Columbia University/New York State Psychiatric Institute. In addition to his duties at WRCH, Dr. Saleh serves on the UMass Medical School Institutional Review Board and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts State Pharmacy Advisory Committee. Since 2012, he has maintained a faculty appointment at Griffin Memorial Hospital in Norman, Oklahoma. He is a supervisor in our Forensic Psychiatry fellowship program and serves as an advisor for our medical students in the Capstone Scholarship and Discovery Course. Dr. Saleh is known for his interest in humanities and psychiatry and has served as a resource to our residents in this area.
