


SPRING 2020 TEACHER WORKSHOP SERIES



Teaching Civil Rights: A Workshop for Educators

Since 2000, veterans of the 1960's freedom movements have worked to share their informational wealth with youth leading Black, Indigenous, and Immigrants' Rights movements throughout the country. In this workshop, we will explore resources for teaching K-12 students about the connections between the 1960's freedom movements and civic activism today among young people.

These resources include SNCC Digital Gateway, film, role plays, and using oral history techniques in the classroom.
