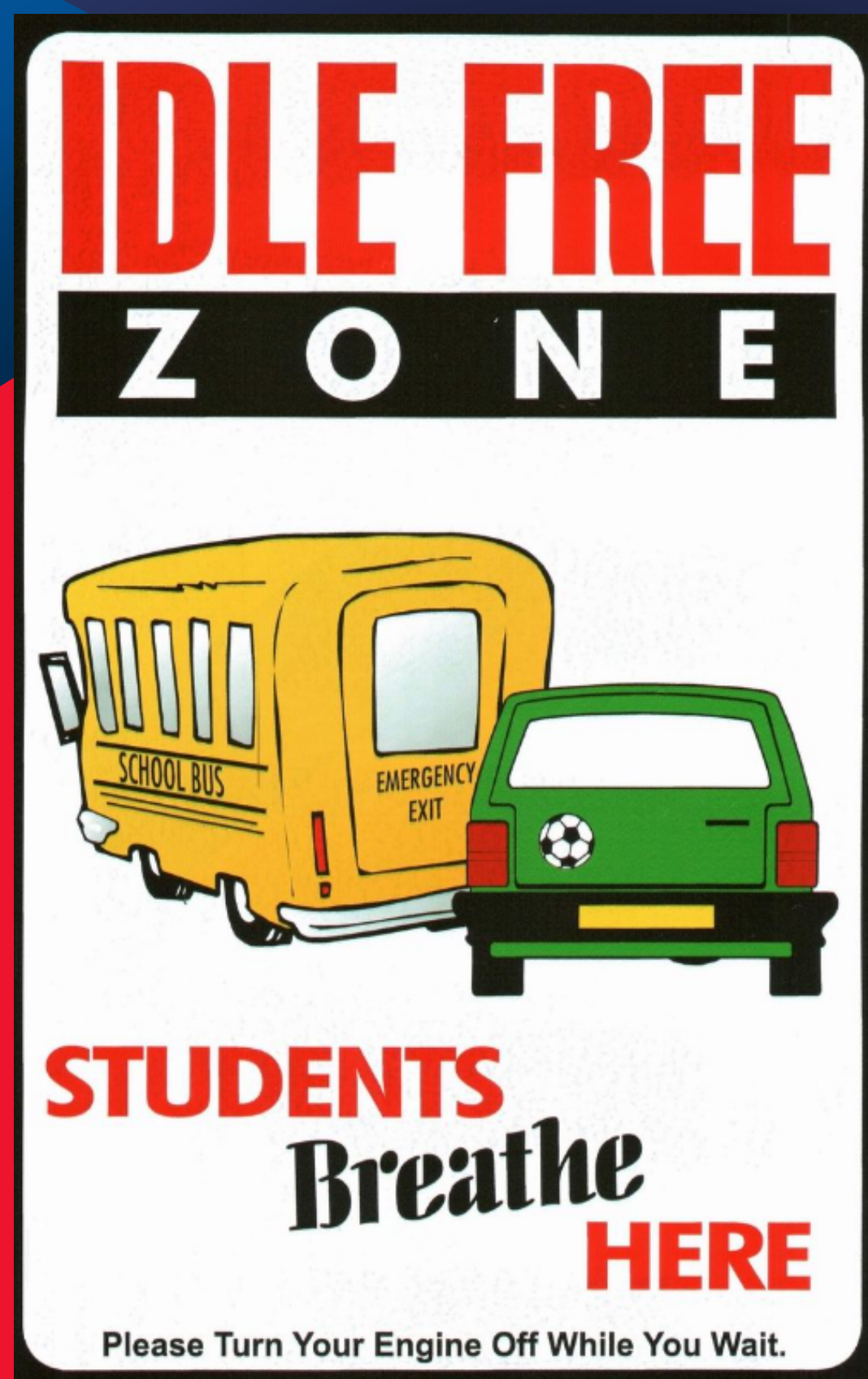
CLEAN AIR AT SCHOOLS
