Free Teacher Memberships



The Dixon Gallery and Gardens is offering free Teacher Memberships to all pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade teachers beginning April 22, 2019. This membership includes free admission, biweekly email updates, discounted admission on adult workshops and programs, invitations to exclusive events, a 10% discount in the museum's store and Park+Cherry café, and a \$20 discount to upgrade to the Family/Dual level memberships. Any teacher in the mid-south is welcome to apply.

The Dixon offers a variety of recourses for teachers. Field trips for all grade levels are offered for free with advance notice, along with both self-guided and guided tours. Dixon Discoveries (Grades PreK-5) includes an interactive tour of the museum or gardens with a hands-on activity, aligning with curriculum standards. The Dixon provides an opportunity for educators to apply to receive transportation funding for one bus per school year. The Art to Grow program (Grades PreK-8) physically brings the Dixon into classrooms with multi-disciplinary, hands-on art activities designed around the Dixon's exhibitions and gardens schedule.

The Dixon will be opening the new Liz and Tommy Farnsworth Education Building on May 4th, 2019, 10:00am-2:00pm, with a free and open to the public event, *Yes We're Open! Family Day*. The Liz and Tommy Farnsworth Education Building will better connect the existing museum and garden programs, and be a catalyst for launching new experiences at the Dixon.
