2. How were the courses assigned to students and teachers in Canvas?

FLVS courses are assigned to students' Canvas accounts based on the courses they are enrolled in according to PowerSchool. FLVS courses are loaded to teachers' Canvas accounts based on the course(s) they teach according to PowerSchool.

3. How do students and teachers access the FLVS course(s) in Canvas?

- Step 1: Log into Clever

- Step 2: Click on the red Canvas tile listed under Curriculum
- Step 3: Click on Dashboard



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- Step 4: Click on the course tile
- Step 5: Once you click on the course tile, you will see the FLVS modules and lessons.

3. What do the FLVS course and modules include?

For teachers, each FLVS course starts with a **Welcome Folder** which contains the following:

- eTeacherGuide
- Course Information
- Lessons

Teachers should carefully read each of these components in order to gain an understanding of the content and resources contained in the course. In addition to the Welcome folder, each course also contains a **Getting Started folder** which provides detailed information about the lessons and activities found within the course. Each FLVS course consists of modules which contain pretests, self-paced lessons, and post-assessments for students to complete at the discretion of the teacher. The number of modules and lessons found within a course will vary across grades and content.

For students, each FLVS course starts with a **Welcome Folder** which contains the following:

- Course Information
- Lessons

Students will also see a **Getting Started folder** which provides detailed information about such topics as Things to Know, Lesson Navigation, Online Learning ABC's and Academic Integrity. Teachers should encourage students to view the information in the Getting Started folder in



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order to help students understand what their experience will be like as they navigate through the modules within the course.

4. How do teachers know which FLVS lessons to use to supplement the instruction that they are providing daily to students?

The Curriculum & Instruction Department has created crosswalks to identify specific lessons within the FLVS modules that align to the specific TN Academic Standards. The FLVS crosswalks can be found in the Curriculum Maps folder in SharePoint. Click [here](#) to access the FLVS crosswalks.

Before assigning lessons to students within the FLVS course, teachers should carefully read through the Course Information and Lessons sections to familiarize themselves with the materials that students will need in order to complete the lessons within the modules. Some lessons require students to download text or have access to specific manipulatives, so it will be important that teachers are aware of these expectations. It will be important to be aware of these expectations so that students are not assigned lessons that they are not able to complete due to challenges related to accessing a printer or specific manipulatives.
