

DISTRICT TEACHER ADVISORY COUNCIL (DTAC) NOMINATIONS ARE IN AND VOTING IS SOON TO BEGIN!

What is the District Teacher Advisory Council?

The DTAC is voice for SCS educators in the District's decision-making process. It empowers the Superintendent with teachers' insights, suggestions, and perspectives on critical educational issues. The DTAC will enable better educational decisions, which will ultimately lead to greater student learning and success.

How will I know who is running for council?

Every teacher, librarian and counselor in the school district will receive an email with the validated nominees for **their school** via electronic ballots with the approved nominees.

Who may vote in the election?

Teachers, Librarians, and School Counselors

When do we vote?

Voting will take place via electronic ballot on **November 30, 2020** through **December 2, 2020**. Each teacher, librarian, and counselor will receive a ballot (OR ballot link) in his/her email listing the candidates currently working at the voter's school.

Qualifications: A District Teacher Advisory Council member shall be a teacher or teacher-type employee. One representative will be selected by the teachers and teacher types within each school. When selecting a nominee, you can only nominate someone from the school at which you are currently working, and self-nominations are prohibited. Any nominations from you for yourself or someone outside of your home school, will be disqualified.

DTAC Criteria: A representative on the council shall not be an AR representative or Association Leadership. He or she shall have an attendance rate of 95% or above and a TEM Professionalism score of 4 or 5. Nominees must have a history of being solution oriented and project a positive image of the District. Each nominee will be reviewed for Human Resources labor referral file.
