The first film blasts on to the screen at 7:30pm. The West Palm Beach Arts & Entertainment District is presenting this unique showcase of world-renowned short films. Director Amy Nicholson's documentary, "*Pickle*" examines the complicated relationships humans have with their pets in a film of unexpected warmth and mirth.
