



SUPPLIES

INSTRUCTIONS




Coffee Run: Decaf Version






Coffee Run: Espresso Version

INSTRUCTIONS


- 1 Cut construction paper into long, thick strips that are the same size.

- 6 Wear your animal ears with pride!









SUPPLIES

Beat the Heat Recipes

Beat the heat and have some fun with these summer recipes.



FRESH LEMONADE

INGREDIENTS:

- 12 lemons
- 2 cups sugar
- 8 cups cold water

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1 Squeeze 9 lemons into a large pitcher.
- 2 Add 2 cups of sugar (or add less to taste) and 8 cups of cold water into the pitcher.
- 3 Stir well.
- 4 Slice the remaining lemons and add to lemonade.
- 5 Pour over a cup of ice and enjoy!



GRILLED FRUIT KEBOBS

INGREDIENTS:

- **Variety of fresh fruit** (pineapple, bananas, pears, mangoes, grapes, strawberries, peaches, etc.)
- **4–8 skewers, metal or wooden**

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1 Cut fruit into large chunks or cubes.
 - 2 Place the fruit securely on skewers.
 - 3 Heat your grill for at least 10 minutes. Scrape grill and coat with a neutral oil (to help avoid sticking).
 - 4 Place skewers on the grill. Check every five minutes for sear marks. They will be done when the insides of the fruit are warm.
- QUICK TIP** • If using wooden skewers, soak them in water for at least 30 minutes before using.



HOMEMADE ICE CREAM

This recipe makes about one pint.

INGREDIENTS:

- 3 one gallon freezer bags
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup salt, plus a pinch extra
- Measuring cup
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- Towel
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 10 cups ice

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1 Pour milk, heavy cream, sugar, pinch of salt and vanilla extract into one freezer bag.
- 2 Remove as much air as possible, seal the bag and mix together.
- 3 Pour 5 cups of ice in the second freezer bag. Add 1/2 cup of salt and mix together.
- 4 Repeat for the third freezer bag (5 cups ice and 1/2 cup salt mixed together).
- 5 On half of the towel, lay the bags flat sandwiching the ice cream mix between the two bags of ice mixture. Fold the other half of the towel over the bags for insulation.
- 6 Let the ice cream mix freeze (approximately 30 minutes or more).
- 7 Once frozen, serve by cutting a corner of the bag and squeezing into a bowl. Add toppings of choice.
