WEEK 4 HOW TO PRAY TO GOD**

After watching the video together – Say the point and Bible verse together

Point: When I pray at night or during the day, God is listening to what I say.

Bible Verse: Psalm 55:17 “Morning, noon, and night ... the LORD hears my voice.”

- When is the best time to pray?
 - *Anytime! God is always listening.*

Discussion Guide –

- 1.What do you think “pray” means?
- 2.How do you think prayer can show love for God?
- 3.Some people pray out loud, some pray quietly in their heads, some sing to God, and some sit silently to listen to God. Which types of prayer do you want to try out?
- 4.What kinds of things do you think are important to talk to God about?
- 5.What questions do you have about prayer?
 - *Let kids talk about their questions and be honest if you don't have answers.*

2. Who needs you to pray for them this week?
3. What will help you to remember to pray each day?
