The road to our new building is finally heading in the right direction. Al though it may not be fully ready until late 2023, we are at least on our way. Mike Miller, City Councilman, is the liaison between the City Council and Island Seniors. He is quite knowledgeable of what we do and stand for, has been a kayak leader and is very supportive of our programming. We all feel this is a good step forward and another way to ensure both the City and the Island Seniors Board are cognizant of what is happening along the way to our new facility. FACTOID #3: Multiple inspections and studies show the current Center4Life is a NON-CONFORMING building. No amount of money or repairs will meet the needs of the Seniors nor retain the building within safety standards. The building can not be added on to for more room, the roof needs total replacement and the HVAC system requires a new sloped roof and trusses at a cost beyond FEMA's authorization for repair of a non-conforming building. Classes have been cancelled, dinners and socials have had to be moved outside the building, and parking is limited. All this led the City to purchase a new C4L building.

TO MASK OR NOT TO MASK

City Council voted on August 7th to mandate masks in all City of Sanibel owned facilities. This includes the Sanibel Recreation Center. The Board of Directors of Island Seniors, Inc. decided that until it is clear and the pandemic is under control again, all people participating in activities through the Island Seniors, MUST wear a mask upon entering the Sanibel Recreation Center.


