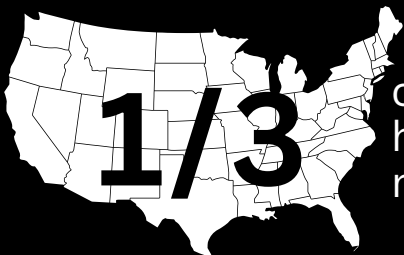

MARYLAND'S AFFORDABILITY GAP

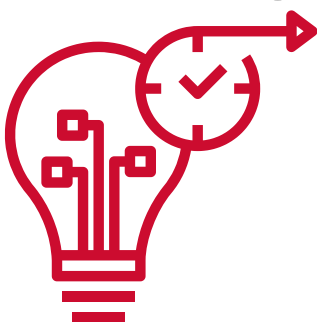
In 2023: 133K Chromebooks were distributed.

288K Marylanders signed up for the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). The state's Emergency Broadband Benefit (MEBB) program reaches 33% of eligible households by July 2023. 54% of households still lack a digital device.

In 2024: ACP sunsets & MEBB ends.

Maryland's Connected Devices Program ends. 287,772 Marylanders lose ACP and broadband subsidies.

HIGHLIGHTING MARYLAND'S DIGITAL INCLUSION EFFORTS



Garrett County

- 1,527 Chromebooks distributed
- Grant funding on track to connect 2,500 homes to fiber broadband
- Awarded Connect Humanity grant to develop a Digital Opportunity Plan

Baltimore County

- Awarded \$26M+ in grant funding to support broadband
- 13,600 Chromebooks distributed
- Named a 2024 Visionary Trailblazer by NDIA

Baltimore City

- 50K devices distributed
- Named a 2024 Visionary Trailblazer by NDIA
- 30 local organizations awarded \$3M in Digital Equity Funds to close the digital divide

Carroll County

- 79% of addresses have access to reliable internet
- 4,000 addresses are scheduled or under construction

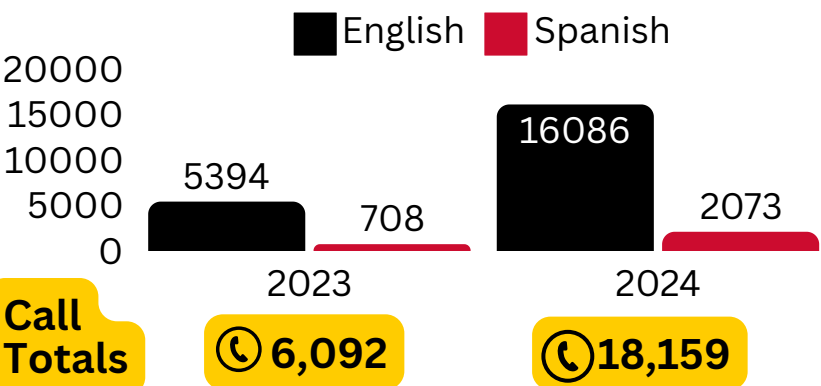
Montgomery County

- Reached nearly 29K residents through Senior Planet programs
- Distributed 117K laptops
- MoCo broadband expanded to 6 affordable housing developments

Southern Maryland

- St. Mary's County recognized as the #1 Digital County for its size
- Charles County distributed 5,000 Chromebook devices and has connected 98% of addresses to broadband
