ADVENT READING - HOPE

First Reader-

This is the First Sunday in Advent. Today we light one purple candle. It is the candle of Hope. We wait for the day when we can again celebrate the birth of our Lord and Messiah, Jesus of Bethlehem. We live in the Hope and Anticipation that all will come to know and worship God.

Second Reader-

When we look at the first candle, we remember God's promise. God promised to send a Savior to the people. When we listen to our Scripture reading, we hear what the prophet Isaiah wrote about God. God fulfills the promises made to care for people. God is loving and just. God brings peace and this gives us hope. We anticipate the time when everything is fair, when the world is at peace, and all people are treated justly.

First Reader- Isaiah 2:1-5

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. ²In the days to come the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. ³Many peoples shall come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth instruction and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. ⁴He shall judge between the nations and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation; neither shall they learn war any more. ⁵O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!

Dear God, thank you for Your Son Jesus. Thank you for the words of the prophet Isaiah that remind us that you are the source of our hope. Help us to live in anticipation of the Light of the World coming into our hearts and into the world.
