GRETCHEN RUSH

Gretchen has been playing tennis since 1975, during which she had an impressive professional career. She was a four-time All-American at Trinity University in San Antonio, Texas, where she played tennis from 1983 to 1986. While at Trinity, she was the nation's top collegiate tennis player in 1986 and won the Broderick Award (which is now the Honda Sports Award).

Gretchen reached the singles quarter finals at Wimbledon, the US Open and the French Open during her career. She won three top-level singles titles: Auckland in 1987, Schenectady in 1988 and Moscow in 1989. In 1988 she was runner-up in the mixed doubles at Wimbledon. Gretchen retired from the professional tour in 1992 but has continued to play and teach tennis in the years succeeding.

In 2016, she was inducted to the Women's Collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame.
