BLACK HISTORY MONTH

FEBRUARY

Black History Month, or National African American History Month, is an annual celebration of achievements by Black Americans and a time for recognizing the central role of African Americans in U.S. history.

HISTORY

In September 1915, the Harvard-trained historian Carter G. Woodson and the prominent minister Jesse E. Moorland founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (ASNLH), an organization dedicated to researching and promoting achievements by Black Americans and other peoples of African descent. Known today as the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH), the group sponsored a national "Negro History Week" in 1926, choosing the second week of February to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass.

By the late 1960s, negro history week had evolved into Black history month on many college campuses. President Gerald R. Ford officially recognized Black history month in 1976. Since then, every U.S. President has officially designated the month of February as Black history month and endorsed a specific theme. The theme for 2022 is "Black health and wellness." Other countries around the world, including Canada and the United Kingdom, also devote a month to celebrating lack history.
