

Cumulative Total COVID-19 Cases Showing Statewide Total and by County (6/12/20)



## Positive COVID-19 Cases Per Capita by County, June 12, 2020



Active Cases in Isolation per Capita by County (June 12, 2020)



Cumulative Maui Cases compared to New Cases by Day (6/12/20)



Hawaii COVID-19 New Daily Cases by County Over Time as of 6/12/20



New Daily Cases by County over last 30 days (June 12, 2020)



Active Cases in Isolation by Day by County (June 12, 2020)



# Good News & Bad News

- **The Good News** is that all of the new cases on Oahu were identified through contact tracing.
- This is a good sign that the Hawaii Department of Health is capable of tracking new cases as they come up so we can limit potential outbreaks in our community (especially following Memorial Day weekend).

# Good News & Bad News

- **The Bad News** is that Oahu has reported 41 new cases over the past 7 days (from 431 to 472 total cases).
- DOH does not consider this a “second wave,” but it does show how important it is for us to limit gatherings and large parties, and to maintain physical distancing as much as possible.

# County of Maui partners to donate \$230,000 to Maui Nonprofits

- The County of Maui matched a \$115,000 donation from the Hawaii Resilience Fund at the Hawaii Community Foundation for COVID-19 relief efforts.
- The public-private partnership provides food assistance to recently unemployed individuals and people in need.
- The funds will be deployed to nonprofits Feed My Sheep, Maui Food Bank and Hui No Ke Ola Pono to distribute food on Maui, Molokai and Lanai.
- Mahalo to the Hawaii Community Foundation, Bank of Hawaii Foundation and many others for helping to organize this effort.

# The Governor's 9th Proclamation

- The Governor and Attorney General have notified us that hotels and motels will continue to be allowed to house out of state visitors subject to the 14-day quarantine.
- The Governor also clarified that other **transient vacation rentals** will be allowed to operate starting Tuesday, June 16, but can only accommodate persons not subject to the 14-day quarantine.

# **Hotels & Transient Vacation Rentals under Governor's Proclamation**

- **Hotels and motels will continue to be allowed to house out of state visitors subject to the 14-day quarantine.**
- **This also includes certain condo-hotels and timeshares, which operate similar to hotels and have the ability to effectively monitor quarantine requirements (i.e. front desk, housekeeping and other full-time staff, etc.). The State is compiling a list of hotels and hotel-like properties.**

# Hotels & Short-Term Rentals Under Governor's Proclamation

- **Transient vacation rentals will be allowed to operate starting Tuesday, June 16, but can only accommodate persons not subject to the 14-day quarantine.**
  - This means condominium units that are zoned hotel or that are on the short-term occupancy list, B&Bs and STRHs could potentially rent to interisland travelers, residents and guests not subject to the 14-day quarantine, such as out of state visitors who have completed their quarantine at a hotel.
  - **These TVRs are allowed to take reservations now, but renters will not be able to begin their stay until Tuesday, June 16.**

# Hotels & Short-Term Rentals Under Governor's Proclamation

- The Governor's proclamation also includes host liability, so TVR owners may be subject to enforcement if they rent to individuals who are subject to the 14-day quarantine, which, if convicted, could include jail time of up to one year and a fine of up to \$5,000.
- **Illegal TVRs continue to be disallowed and will be held responsible for violating County law and the Public Health Emergency Rules, in addition to zoning violations.**

# Household Hazardous Waste Collection – Appointment ONLY

- The deadline to make an appointment for the annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection event is Monday, June 15.
- The collection event is set for June 28.
- The service is offered by **appointment ONLY**.
- To make an appointment, call Cameron Chemical Corp. at (808) 695-2999 to schedule a drop off time.
- Callers should be prepared to list the waste items they will be dropping off.

# Household Hazardous Waste Collection – Appointment ONLY

- Accepted items include: aerosols, antifreeze, car batteries, household batteries, fire extinguishers, fluorescent bulbs and tubes, oil-based paint, old medications, pesticides, solvents and thermometers.
  - If you have an item not listed, ask about it while making an appointment.
- This service is for residents ONLY.

# Reopenings for Monday, June 15

- Bars will be allowed to operate with modifications.
- Outdoor organized team sports will start Phase 1, which includes practice and skill-building drills, with modifications.
  - Phase 2: Competitive team play may resume July 1.

# Reopenings for Monday, June 15


- **Canoe paddling** (6-person and 12-person) will resume with modifications.
- **Indoor gatherings** will expand to a total of 50 persons.
- **Outdoor gatherings** have expanded to a total of 100 persons.
