Job description:

The MARVEL*US Program is an 8-week summer program that serves approximately 40-50 TANF eligible youth ages 9-13. From designing their own superhero to writing a comic book, youth learn to model behavior, expand creative skills, enhance physical abilities, explore new and exciting places in Ohio and overall develop flexible and higher-order thinking that allows learners to apply their knowledge to the real world. MARVEL*US Camp Counselors lead children through their daily activity schedule while encouraging and empowering them to participate in activities such as sports, music, art, and more. Camp Counselors work in collaboration with the LEAD Counselor to assure all participants are safe, learning, and having fun.

Responsibilities:

- Take primary responsibility for health, well-being and happiness of youth participants.
- Make connections with participants and develop meaningful relationships.
- Actively manage participant's behavior and apply age appropriate management techniques as needed.
- Engage parents/guardians at drop off and pick up to establish a sense of connection.
- Encourage respect for other participants, personal property, equipment and facilities.
- Present a positive example at all times, understanding that poor behavior can have lasting impact on youth participants.
- Exhibit a level of athleticism for safe participation in physical activities.
- Communicate regularly with leadership regarding any issues, concerns or challenges, as well as any pertinent updates on participants.
- Special projects and other duties as assigned.

Requirements:

- High school diploma / GED (required).
- Love of children and being outdoors.
- Ability to teach and lead various educational activities.
- Abundant enthusiasm, patience, a great sense of humor and self-control.
- First Aid/CPR Certification preferred but not required.
- Understand how to communicate and work with children ages 9-12.
