Pastor's
Message

Step outside on a spring morning, and nature sings its own kind of praise. Birds call out from the trees, fish break atop the water’s surface, and even the breeze seems to hum through the branches. No one teaches them to do this. It’s simply what they were made to do. Psalm 150:6 says, “Let every-thing that has breath praise the Lord.” And creation leads the way.

This past Sunday, our church joined that chorus in a special way. It was Mother’s Day, and our worship service reflected the beauty of every generation lifting praise. Children played hand-bells, drummed on buckets, and waved ribbons with joy. Students and adults led with instru-ments and voices. What a gift to witness the whole family of God worshipping together! It was a powerful reminder that there’s a place for each of us to use our gifts to glorify God and strengthen His church.

This coming Sunday, we’ll gather around the Lord’s Table to remember Christ’s sacrifice and celebrate His presence with us. We’ll reflect on what it means that Jesus was *like us*—fully hu-man in every way. He didn’t remain distant—He stepped into our world, shared our struggles, felt our pain, and faced death itself. Because He was like us, He could truly stand in our place.

Then on May 25, we’ll be led in worship by our friends from Renewal Ranch. Their stories are powerful reminders that no one is beyond the reach of God’s grace. Renewal Ranch is a Christ-centered recovery ministry that helps men break free from addiction by finding new life in Je-sus. As they share testimonies and lead us in worship, we’ll be reminded once again that the gospel is not just good news—it’s life-changing news.

Also, don’t forget to spread the word about our upcoming Community Health Fair this Satur-day, May 17, from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. in the Gym. This is a great opportunity to invite friends and neighbors who would benefit from free health screenings, wellness resources, and conversations with local medical professionals. There will also be activities for kids, door priz-es, and helpful information for the whole family.

Praise the Lord for this past Sunday! Not only did we gather for worship of our Savior, but we were led by all generations in our church – children, youth, adults.

I believe that Multi-Generational Worship is a Biblical model but also essential to the ministry of the local church. The Old and New Testaments have given us clarity on how all generations should worship together.

Psalm 145:4-7: *“One generation commends your works to another; they tell of your mighty acts. They speak of the glorious splendor of your majesty—and I will meditate on your wonderful works. They tell of the power of your awesome works—and I will proclaim your great deeds, they celebrate your abundant goodness and joyfully sing of your righteousness.”*

This passage gives us 5 activities that all generations should do together. They should commend, tell, speak, celebrate, and sing. The Psalmist is so affected by this worship experience that it compels him to both internally meditate and externally proclaim.

Look at Ephesians 5:18-21, *“...be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your heart to the Lord; always giving thanks for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God, even the Father; and be subject to one another in the fear of Christ.”*

Or look at Colossians 3:16 as Paul declares this a second time, *“Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, with all wisdom teaching and admonishing one another with psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in your hearts to God.”*

Why Multi-Generational Worship?

- The Bible commands it.
- It cultivates an “on Earth as it is in Heaven” environment.
- It brings unity within the body of Christ.
- It teaches the individual church member.
- It edifies the body of Christ.
- It trains up leaders and not performers.
- It affects eternity.
