



Invite Everyone, Invest In People, Impact Eternity



At just sixteen years old, Jessica Watson set sail from Sydney, Australia, determined to do what many believed was impossible—sail around the world alone, nonstop, and without assistance. For 210 days she lived on her small boat, battling towering waves, fierce storms, and long stretches of isolation.

Some nights the sea was so calm her boat hardly moved, and other nights the waves crashed with such force it felt as if the ocean itself wanted to swallow her whole.

Yet on May 15, 2010, after traveling more than 23,000 nautical miles, Jessica sailed back into Sydney Harbor. Thousands cheered as she returned home, having proven the doubters wrong and having completed a journey that tested every ounce of her determination and courage.

Few will ever make that trek around the world, but all of us are invited to a journey that is far greater. It doesn't just stretch over tens of thousands of miles—it spans a lifetime and reaches into eternity. And it requires the same kind of resolve: to keep moving forward when the seas are calm and when the storms are fierce. That journey is the journey of discipleship.

This Sunday we'll close our series *The Journey* by listening to Jesus' words in John 14:12: "I tell you the truth, anyone who believes in me will do the same works I have done, and even greater works, because I am going to be with the Father." The call of discipleship is not only to believe in Him or to walk beside Him—it's to do as He does.

And at the end of each service, we've been challenging you to make a commitment. We've been focusing on three essential steps: first-time faith in Jesus, baptism, and church membership. Some of us have been dragging our feet on these decisions, but these are the basics every traveler must settle before setting out.

Another defining feature of a disciple is sharing the good news of Jesus with others. That's why I want to highlight an incredible opportunity coming up on October 8—Fields of Faith. This event is designed to let students hear testimonies from their peers, but it also provides adults a unique and simple way to practice sharing the gospel. Many Christians have never shared their faith, often out of fear of rejection or not knowing what to say. Fields of Faith takes away that barrier: adult volunteers are given a simple card with clear instructions, and then students—eager to hear the truth about Jesus—come to you.
