The Gift of Life: Understanding the Importance of Organ Donation

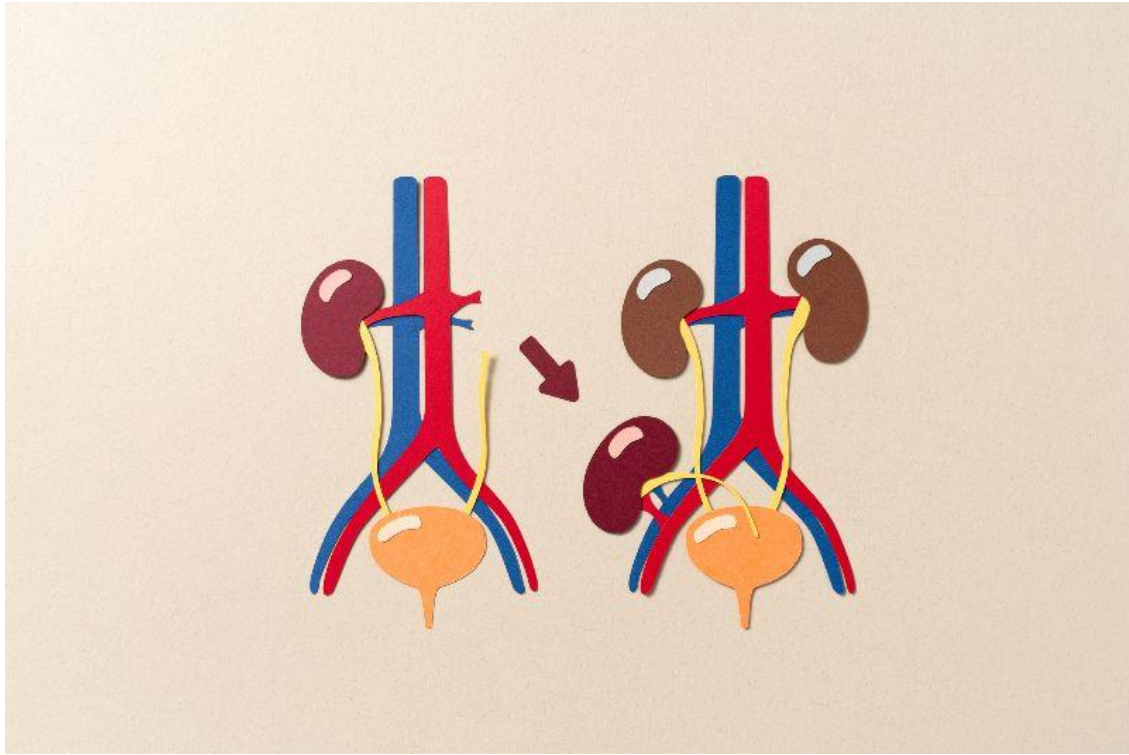
