How a STEMI Network Saves Lives in Heart Attacks



A ST-segment elevation myocardial infarction (STEMI) is an acute heart attack indicated by a dramatic change in an electrocardiogram of the heart. While all

heart attacks are serious medical emergencies, STEMIs require immediate intervention because an artery or arteries are blocked, reducing blood flow to the heart muscle by as much as 100%.

At UofL Health, a STEMI network is the term we use to describe the partnership between UofL Health and regional emergency medical services for the purposes of providing the fastest access to lifesaving care.
