THE C. G. JUNG INSTITUTE was founded in 1945 and was the first Jungian analytic training program in the world. The Institute trains psychotherapists to become Jungian analysts and maintains a collegial society to provide continuing education and ethical review for member analysts. The Jung Institute also operates the Whitney Center for Psychotherapy which provides sliding scale therapy to Bay Area residents and is a two-year part-time CAPIC approved doctoral training program for clinicians pursuing psychology degrees, as well as for MFT and ASW registered associates, and offers a one-year 12 hr/wk elective rotation for PGY-4 psychiatry residents.
