Dear Faithful Franciscans,

A blessed season of Epiphany to you all! As we've heard over the past couple of weeks, Epiphany is that season in which we hear about the multiple ways in which God has been revealed in Jesus Christ. We began the season following the star, the brilliance of that great light, that led the magi to the holy family. The next week we were with John and his open-air congregation on the banks of the River Jordan as Jesus was willingly baptized and revealed to the crowds as the beloved of God.

WHY EPISCOPAL?

Rediscovering Faith and Practice



During this season, each of us is invited to reflect on how God has been disclosed to the world, but also to open our eyes

and minds to where God is currently revealed in our midst. This might be easier said than done in our current moment that seems saturated with divisiveness and fear and anxiety. What I have found helpful in seeing how God is to return to the source, the foundational elements of faith and prayer and practice that have formed people of faith for centuries.

In fact, this desire to get to the root of who we are is, in no small part, what animates our "Why Episcopal?" adult education series. Each session of *Why Episcopal?* is given over to investigating bedrock aspects of our shared faith and practice (Scripture, Creeds, Worship, Sacraments, etc.). What we've discovered together is that each session really has been the tip of a huge iceberg; there is so much more to say on each of these topics than the allotted hour.



LEGACY GIVING UPDATE



This past year we have truly seen faith in action.

The purpose of the Endowment Fund is to supplement the activities and experiences of our Parish community life which are not part of our annual budget. Over the past year the Legacy Giving Committee recommended, and the Vestry approved, several gifts, all of which enhance our St. Francis experience.

In Christian Formation we honored a request from Fr. Drew to fund the materials for his very successful Parenting Class in the spring, and we supplemented the needs of the Vacation Bible School with a small gift. The request for support for the Women's Ministry retreat was also enthusiastically approved.

It seems that the acolytes were in need of extra robes. The Endowment income seemed a fitting source for that much needed addition to our most valued acolyte program.

Finally, to assist in bringing our parish presentations, meetings, and other uses for visual technology into the modern age, the committee approved a request for funding of two TV's, mounts, and a cart. We will now be able to hook up our laptops to the screens for visual impact, and let's not forget – use less paper for committee meetings.

In all, the committee disbursed \$5,165. I trust we will all agree these funds went a very long way to touch many people in our parish in worship, learning, and those small needs, which often go a very long way to making our St. Francis parish the very special community it is.

THE BARNABAS NETWORK: RECYCLING FURNITURE, RESTORING LIVES

The Barnabas Network provides basic home furnishings at no cost to qualified families and individuals on the path to self-sufficiency. Their clients are transitioning out of homelessness, recovering from a major setback, fleeing abuse or violence, or overcoming severe poverty. The furniture is donated by individuals, businesses, and civic and faith organizations.

You can help by donating your cast-off furniture, mattresses, bedding, and housewares. Clients are pre-qualified by one of more than 200 agencies including churches, schools, and social service agencies. Barnabas makes an appointment for clients to come pick out their own furniture from their warehouse stock. A family can find everything they need to start a new life in a new home. Barnabas provides mattresses, box springs, bed frames, armchairs, sofas or loveseats, dining tables and chairs, chests of drawers, small tables, pots and pans, clean bedding, linens, tableware, washers/dryers, stoves/refrigerators, small appliances, lamps, and towels.
