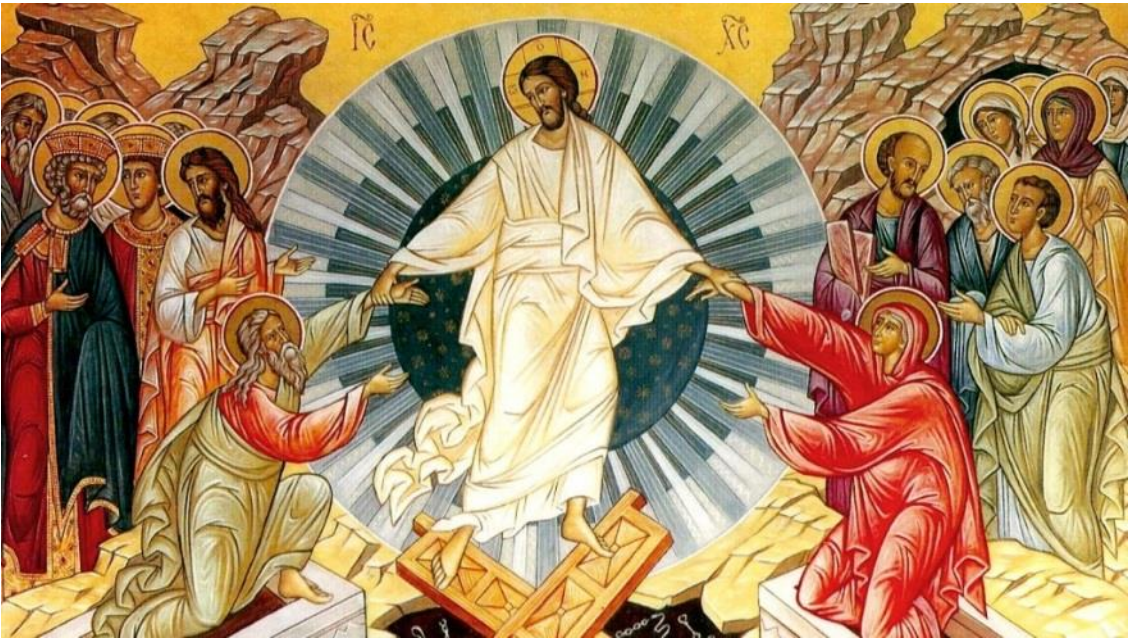

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles:

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

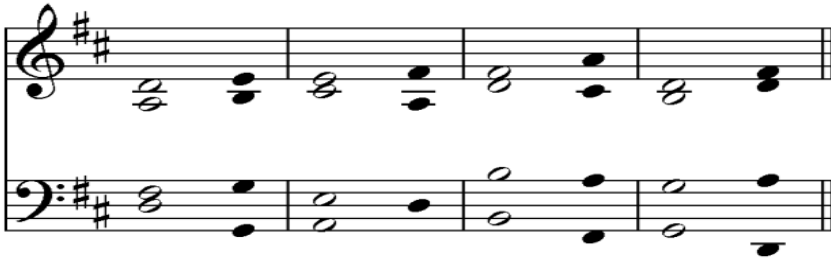
We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

Revelation 21:10, 22-22:5

A reading from the Book of Revelation:

In the spirit the angel carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day-- and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

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THE HOLY GOSPEL

John 14:23-29

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus said to Judas (not Iscariot), "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Father who sent me.

"I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. You heard me say to you, 'I am going away, and I am coming to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe."

PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATES

Bishop: The Candidates will now be presented.

Presenter: I present Felicia Coleman, Tim Coleman and Lexie Walters for Confirmation.

Presenter: I present David Smith to be received into this Communion.

Bishop: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil?

Candidate: I do.

Bishop: Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

Candidate: I do, and with God's grace I will follow him as my Savior and Lord.

Please stand.

Bishop: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

Congregation: We will.

Bishop: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Bishop: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.

Bishop: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: I will, with God's help.

PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATES

Bishop: Let us now pray for these persons who have renewed their commitment to Christ.

Cantor: Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People: Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor: Open their hearts to your grace and truth.

Renew in these your servants the covenant you have made with them at their Baptism. Send them forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Bishop: *N.*, we recognize you as a member of the one holy catholic and apostolic Church, and we receive you into the fellowship of this Communion. God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and keep you. **Amen.**

Bishop: Almighty and everliving God, let your fatherly hand ever be over these your servants; let your Holy Spirit ever be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of your Word, that they may serve you in this life, and dwell with you in the life to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE COMMISSIONING OF STEPHEN MINISTER LEADERS

Bishop: Every Christian is called to care for others, and our Stephen Ministry is a powerful way several of us have committed to living out that care. Today we are specifically recognizing our newest Stephen Leaders—those who organize, teach, and supervise our Stephen Ministers, the trained caregivers who provide high-quality, one-to-one care to hurting people in our congregation and community. I invite our new Stephen Leaders to step forward.

(Stephen Leaders come forward.)

Bishop: Fran Collier and Shirley Smith, you have been trained at a Stephen Ministry Bridge Leader's Training Course and have been asked to serve as Stephen Leaders at St. Francis. You are a gift of God to us, helping lead this ministry of equipping and caring.

Bishop: As part of the priesthood of all believers, all of us Christians are called to offer ourselves to our Lord in thanksgiving for what God has done and continues to do for us in Jesus Christ. It is also our privilege to recognize and support those who are trained for specific ministries in this congregation, as we recognize and affirm Stephen Ministry and our new Stephen Leaders.

Bishop: Because of your gifts, your calling, and your training, we charge you with these responsibilities: To spread the word about our Stephen Ministry, educate people about what it involves, and cast a vision for this crucial ministry. To carefully recruit, select, and train congregation members with the gifts, talents, and character to serve as Stephen Ministers. To draw on the resources of our congregation and community to enrich the training and supervision of Stephen Ministers in this congregation. To work with the clergy of this congregation to identify members who could benefit from this confidential caring ministry. To match hurting people with Stephen Ministers based on what will best meet their needs. And to supervise these confidential caring relationships and offer regular opportunities for continuing growth in the skills and practice of caring ministry.

Bishop: Will you assume this ministry in the confidence that it comes from God? If so, respond, “Yes, with the help of God.”

Candidates: Yes, with the help of God.

Bishop: Will you nurture the skills you have learned and use them in service to others—to support, encourage, and build up people, and to enable excellent care while trusting in God’s healing?

Candidates: Yes, with the help of God.

Bishop: Members of St. Francis, will you open your hearts to the ministry of these Stephen Leaders and pray for them as servants of Christ? If so, answer, “Yes, with the help of God.”

People: Yes, with the help of God.

Bishop: Father Matt, will you lift up the ministry of these trained Stephen Leaders by communicating support for Stephen Ministry, recommending Stephen Ministry to those who need this kind of care, encouraging people with the appropriate gifts to serve as Stephen Leaders and Stephen Ministers, and helping our Stephen Ministry have the resources it needs to thrive—thereby helping to “equip the saints for ministry”?

Priest: Yes, with the help of God.

Bishop: Let us pray.
Gracious God, you have called these people to a new path in caring ministry. You have gifted and empowered them for this task. Grant them joy in their service and a spirit of bold trust in you, that their ministry may stir us to greater caring and more fruitful service. Help us all to be both willing servants and thankful recipients of this ministry, so that your name may be glorified, your people live in peace, and your good and gracious will be done, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: Amen.

Bishop: May the Lord of the church fill you with the Holy Spirit and guide, bless, and keep you, so that you may be faithful in the ministry to which you have been called, gifted, trained, and sent.

People: Amen.

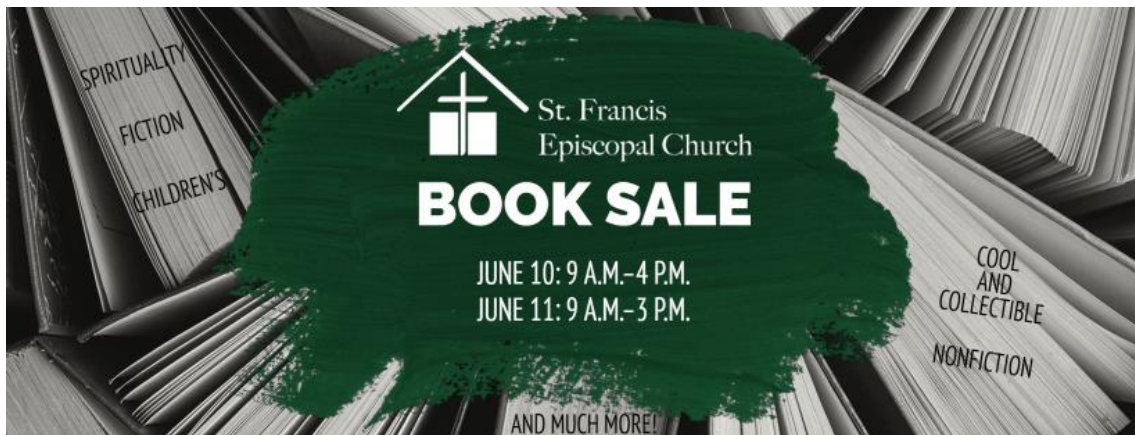
