Creating Your Own Path: Successful Transitions for Persons with Autism

This one-day conference will be held on Thursday, August 29, 2019, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at The Mill Conference Center in Starkville. The importance of transitions for those with autism cannot be stressed enough and doesn't happen overnight. The objective of this conference is to provide parents, advocates, professionals, and people with autism the opportunity to learn about resources and evidence-based best practices regarding planning and executing successful transitions, no matter the age.

Keynote: Dr. Temple Grandin will deliver the keynote address for the conference this year. Dr. Grandin was diagnosed with autism as a young child and did not speak until she was three and a half years old. Thanks to a mother who refused to give up, she was able to overcome many of her early challenges. Dr. Grandin became a prominent author and speaker on both autism and animal behavior. Today she is a professor of Animal Science at Colorado State University. She also has a successful career consulting on both livestock handling equipment design and animal welfare. She has been featured on many national television and radio programs and has a 2010 TED talk.

Who should attend: Anyone who works with, designs, provides supports to, or is a person with autism, such as: teachers, para-professionals, school administrators, advocates, parents, support coordinators, nursing home administrators, and social workers.
