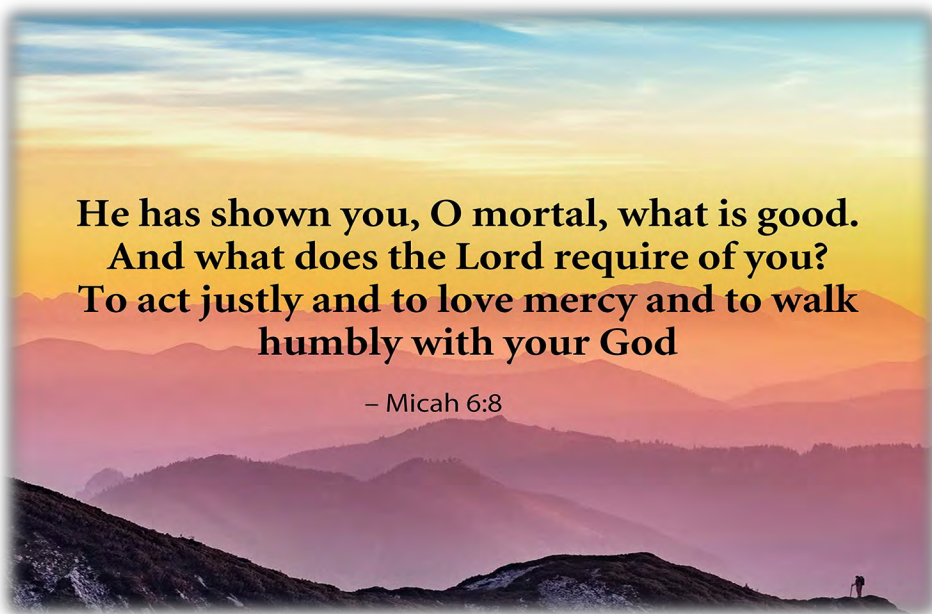


FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY

Ash Wednesday: February 18, 2026 at Noon



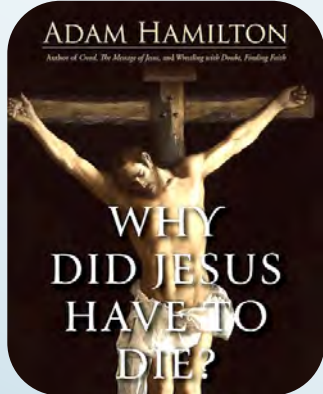

2026 Lenten Bible Study: Why Did Jesus Have to Die?



Please plan to join us for this year’s “Wednesdays-at-Ten” Lenten Study, “Why Did Jesus Have to Die: The Meaning of the Crucifixion” by Adam Hamilton. Despite the crucifixion’s central place in Christian faith, the New Testament offers few clear answers about how Jesus’ death saves, or why, exactly, he had to die. The New Testament writers use a host of metaphors—ransom, sacrifice, reconciliation, victory—but never explain exactly how it works or why it had to happen this way.

This year’s Lenten Study will begin on Wednesday, February 25 at 10 am in the Memorial Parlor. Copies of the book will be available on Sunday mornings in the Narthex. Plan now to join us for this Lenten Journey as we prepare our hearts and minds for the Easter Celebration.
