WHAT ARE THE CURRENT “NORMS” FOR CHURCHES IN THESE NOT-NORMAL TIMES?

As of Friday morning, March 13, 2020 the Pennsylvania Governor has joined others across the nation in calling for a ban on gatherings of more than 250 people, which is called “social distancing.” He has asked for assistance from religious leaders to stop the spread of the virus. The situation is literally changing almost by the hour.

Here are the emerging best practices in a rapidly changing situation

- Nationally, most large gatherings have been suspended through the end of March: this includes major sports, theme parks, and cultural gatherings. Broadway is dark.
- Many sessions are following their local school districts. They plan to cease in-person worship and other gatherings if (when) the school district closes.
- If worship is going forward this Sunday, then increased disinfection is being practiced including:
 - Disinfecting surfaces such as doorknobs and the tops of pews; urging hand sanitizing
 - Collecting offerings at the door; not passing pew pads; refraining from handshakes or hugs; propping doors or having one person open them


- Postponing communion or following careful preparation and distribution practices (contact us for more specifics)
- Eliminating food/drink events or following careful prep and distribution practices (contact us for more specifics)
- Some are already cancelling in-person worship this Sunday, March 15. We expect that this will increase for next Sunday and into the near future. Some congregations, like Westminster Presbyterian Church of West Chester, already have the capability for live-streaming. Others are rapidly working on ways to connect and be in worship together, even if not in person.

LOVING OUR NEIGHBORS

We commend to you the vulnerable populations in our midst – people who are at increased risk for life-threatening illness, people who will be isolated if worship and gatherings are cancelled, those whose financial livelihood is deeply affected if work is shut down, children who will be hungry when schools close. We believe there are significant opportunities here to witness to God's grace in both word and deed. With you, we are looking for these places to act and seeking to participate in God's mission to this fragile world in which we live.

As you develop your plans for staying connected to your isolated members, including those in facilities prohibiting visitors, let us know, so we may share your ideas. As you develop your plans for serving your community (often in partnership with other agencies), let us know.
