

Musings from “The Study”

I have a confession to make! I am an inveterate “discophile!” That’s right, I collect classical compact discs. Operas, symphonies, choral/organ music. I have 100’s of discs! Before the advent of compact discs, I collected vinyl records, many of which I still have. I’m also somewhat of an audiophile. When I was in the Army stationed in Korea, I purchased a complete Sansui stereo system at the PX in Seoul and had it shipped back to the States. (I still have it! I’ve replaced the turntable a couple of times, but the Sansui tuner/amp and the speakers (with their 15”woofers) can still blow-out the windows and part your hair!



That brings me to the topic of Christmas Music. In among the many discs, I have section dedicated to the music of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany. I bring them out the day after Thanksgiving and put them away the day after Epiphany. Choral music, orchestral music, organ music, etc. The music plays almost “non-stop” throughout the whole season. Erin and I sing along, of course, as does Abigail sometimes. She’s not thrilled but she graciously puts up with it. (Actually, she doesn’t have a choice!)

Music is such an integral part of the Advent/Christmas/Epiphany seasons. So much so that we’d be lost without it. If I wasn’t such a “purest,” I’d mix-and-match the hymns throughout the season, regardless of whether they fit the sermon text or not! (Shake things up a little bit!)

When I was “practicing” organist, I loved to play the organ literature that is such an integral part of the season. I would play an afternoon recital of Christmas music in the middle of December which gave me an opportunity to play the pieces which didn’t fit the Sunday morning service.

Come to think of it, I believe we need to add more Christmas hymns to our repertoire on Sunday morning! We only get to sing a small portion of them during the Christmas season anyway, so let’s go for broke! (Don’t tell your friends were doing it, though!)



So, sing lustily and let the anthems and hymns of this season work their magic on you. Believe me, we really aren’t breaking any “liturgical” rules!

Catherine Cox should have listened to God. But the 25-year-old from Alabama, wasn't paying attention, at least not at first, when she decided to leave her hometown to attend Xavier University in New Orleans. She hated it there. She didn't want to go back, but it was hard for her not to because she had gotten a full ride. But when she discovered midway through her first semester that she was expecting twins, she went back home to seek the support of her extended family in raising her children.

Initially she took a break from school, working a variety of jobs to support herself and her children, but then she began to think about her education. She had started college as a business major because her dad said that there was no money in teaching. But she hated accounting, and she always knew she was supposed to be a teacher. "God told me a long time ago that I needed to be a teacher," she said.

And this time, she listened. She enrolled in Stillman College, founded in 1876 by the Rev. Dr. Charles Allen Stillman, a Presbyterian — and never looked back. She graduated this year as a Dean's List Scholar with a degree in Mathematics, which has allowed her not only to fulfill her dream of teaching, but also her dream of teaching math. Stillman College is the only historically Black college in covenant relationship with the PC(USA).

Preparing the way for aspiring young professionals is what both Stillman — and the PC(USA)'s Christmas Joy Offering — are all about. A cherished Presbyterian tradition since the 1930s, the Christmas Joy Offering distributes gifts equally to the Interim Unified Agency's Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color, including Stillman, and to the Assistance Program of the PC(USA)'s Board of Pensions.

Originally founded by the Presbyterian Church as a training school for African American ministers, Stillman's picturesque, 105-acre campus sits within the bounds of the Presbytery of Sheppards and Lapsley and the Synod of Living Waters.

Shortly before graduation, Catherine accepted a position teaching mathematics at Stillman's newest education partner, the I Dream Big Charter School. She credits Stillman's close-knit community and engaged faculty for being instrumental in helping her to succeed.



Catherine is grateful that gifts from the Christmas Joy Offering will help future generations. "Stillman promotes the Presbyterian mission of education," Cox said, "of giving back and of reaching out to those who are lost."

Together, our gifts are preparing the way for more teachers who embrace that shared mission. Thank you for giving whatever you can ... for when we all do a little, it adds up to a lot.
