And now the “darkness” descends! No, it’s not the end of the world, it’s the end of Daylight Savings Time! I always get depressed for the first couple days of “Standard Time” again. During Daylight Savings Time, I love the lingering light in the evening when you can watch the color change on the clouds – from bright orange to purple and finally the curtain comes down

on the show. Erin and I like to walk the dog at twilight when the celestial show is at its peak. Erin will only walk one way around the park so she can view the changes as we go. (I try to change our direction the second time we go around, but to no avail! It’s all about the color!) Now the sun sets too early for our walk.



When we were out west in early October the evenings were colorful! Ghost Ranch is ringed with hills and rock formations which enhance the beauty of the evening “light show!” Our accommodations are on the top of a mesa, so we get a 360-degree view of the sunset. In Isaiah 40, the prophet asks those listening to do a very simple task with major implications: prepare the way. Isaiah is not asking those listening to prepare the way for themselves; rather, our call is to prepare the way for the very real presence of God.

Every year the Christmas Joy Offering, one of the four Churchwide Special Offerings of the Presbyterian Church

(U.S.A.), prepares the way to bring hope through education and emergency assistance.

Three Presbyterian-related schools that equip communities of color, Menaul School in Albuquerque, New Mexico; Presbyterian Pan American School in Kingsville, Texas; and Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, provide a transformative education for students all around the globe. These historic centers of learning prepare the way for students from every walk of life to be active, compassionate and informed citizens of the world. Beyond their schoolwork, these students live together in supportive and intentional communities where they prepare the way for one another through acts of generosity, mission, and service in their community and around the world. In their life together, students experience the love of Christ that we all meet anew at Christmas.

Like the schools and colleges that equip communities of color, the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions prepares a way for church workers to find a measure of peace and security in times of financial crisis. This program provides life-giving and critical assistance at the most vulnerable and anxious times in church workers' lives, like health or housing instability.

Jesus, the Light of the World, brings hope. Perhaps, together, we can bring hope to others by receiving the Christmas Joy Offering to support these vital programs. We are but one of thousands of congregations whose gifts unite to help prepare the way for Christ and ease the paths of those who need us.

There are many ways to participate beyond the gifts we will receive at Christmas. You can pray for the healing of our world, you can look for people the rest of the world does not see and befriend them, or you can find your own way to follow Jesus' call to love our neighbor as ourselves.

And always remember ... when we all do a little, it adds up to a lot.

As we look forward to the stillness of Christmas and celebrate the birth of our Savior, may we prepare a way for him but also for those who need to feel God's love, welcome and embrace.
