These pumpkins started life about 100 days ago on a farm on the Navajo Indian Reservation in Farmington, NM. Great care was taken in planting, growing and harvesting them, to ensure that you get a quality pumpkin with a long shelf life.

Nearly 100% of our farm workforce is Native American, which is very important because the unemployment rate in this region is over 40%. This project and others like it create roughly 25 fulltime jobs and 550 seasonal jobs for Native Americans. Your pumpkin is a **non-GMO** product. After ripening, this pumpkin was

hand loaded on a truck and traveled all the way to the pumpkin patch of the West Gloucester Trinitarian Congregational Church to help raise money for our church's mission and ministry. This pumpkin has helped a lot of folks on his way to you, so treat him nicely! **Hours**
